## Our Life Together Bill McFarland

"Come and see." That's what Philip said to Nathanael, who was questioning whether Jesus could be the one of whom Moses and the prophets had spoken (Jn. 1:46). Perhaps you've read the story with us in our daily Bible reading the last few days. Philip's statement has a couple of applications to us in our work as a congregation. On the one hand, it is the simplest and best invitation of all: come and see for yourself if Jesus is who we think he is. Any of us can make an offer like that to a friend or neighbor. On the other hand, it places upon us the responsibility to conduct ourselves in such a manner that those who do come can see Jesus. All of us have the privilege of helping to do so.

The new teaching year in our Bible School starts with this first Sunday in September. In some ways, it is like no other school, for it seeks to implant God's ways in the lives and hearts of learners. But in some ways, it is just like any other school. Its success depends upon a curriculum to be learned, capable teachers who are enthused about their work, students who are consistently present and ready to do their part, and families who are supportive of the educational process. I encourage each one to help us make it a great year. This would be an outstanding time to renew your involvement in a Bible class.

This morning in my class, we got to begin a study I've titled "The Onechapter Books: Lessons Too Important to Leave Out." I'm looking forward to this series. Also, beginning Wednesday evening, I will have the privilege of teaching the auditorium class. Our theme this quarter will be "Ephesians: To Him Be Glory in the Church." Travis will be teaching the College-Career class and their subject will be "The Life of Christ." Bring a friend and join us!



## Do a good deed; meet a need!

Looking back to the days before electricity and running water I can remember helping my mother with the weekly washing over the typical wash kettle setting over a fire. After boiling the white items, she would take them out and rinse in clear, cold water. That's where I came in - drawing the water from the well then carrying it to the rinse tub. Mother would hasten over and say, "Let's not forget the bluing!" (Goggle Mrs.

Stewart's bluing). I was amazed to see the blue substance hit the clear water for how could something blue add brightness to daddy's white shirts? Yet, she always insisted on using the bluing. I have heard some today criticize the plea that comes from the bible to be "washed in the blood of the Lamb" (Rev. 1:5). They would say, "how could red blood make anything white?" The answer: If by the hands of mere men a substance called "bluing" would make things brighter, who are we to question the creator of all things (John 1:3) of not being able to wash away our sins in the red blood of Jesus? Of course, you should know that the blood of Christ is used metaphorically. But to add to the mystery, the bible demands that we have our sins washed away (Acts 22:16) in the act of scriptural baptism. If you want your shirts whiter - "don't forget the bluing!." If you want redemption from your sins, -"don't forget the blood of Jesus!"
