A Word to Husbands and Wives

Our daily Bible reading the last couple of days has included the Song of Solomon. Whatever view of this unique and fascinating little book may be taken, it is clearly about a relationship over which love is the banner (2:4). Our assumptions about what such a relationship should be like are often blurred by the culture or by our own mistakes. We may benefit from the model provided by the loving couple in this wonderful song.

The first thing that stands out is the tender affection between the two of them. To him, she is "my love." To her, he is "my beloved" (1:15-16). There is a gentleness and a warmth between them which is nourished by the kind way in which they speak to each other.

They admire one another. Each considers the other as special, standing out above the other men or women in the world. To him, she is a flower among the briars, altogether beautiful (2:2; 4:7). To her, he is an apple tree among the ordinary trees of the forest, altogether desirable (2:3; 5:16).

Part of their being beloved to each other is that they are friends who delight in one another's company (5:16). His heart has been captivated, he says, by one glance from her eyes (4:9), and she is thrilled at even the memory of the sound of his voice (2:10; 5:4). The companionship between them is such that they obviously go together.

There is a deep sense of loyalty between the two of them, too. Each loves the other with their soul, with their very self. At least three times in the book it is said: "I am my beloved's and my beloved is mine" (2:16; 6:3; 7:10). They belong to one another in a love that is exclusive.

Each understands that the other values him or her above all other people and, just as importantly, above all things and all tasks. There is something between them which no one else is allowed to interfere (2:8; 8:4).

There is clearly a wonderful, mutually enjoyable intimacy between them. They praise each other physically. They think of their relationship as a precious, secret garden which they visit together. It thrills their lives.

This book is at least partly here to provide for us an education in love. It holds up before us a model of how a husband and a wife are to treat each other. Our lives are best when we honor this instruction.
