Speaking of counting blessings, is it something you regularly do? Life works better when we purposefully exercise the discipline of gratitude. In fact, a person has not matured much until he can recognize that he has been "graced," and can stir within himself the humility and appreciation that should grow from that fact, and can finally respond to the gift with appropriate grateful behavior.

Especially where our relationship with the Lord is concerned, the discipline of gratitude runs the machinery of life. Thanksgiving is the only real sacrifice that can be given to God (Ps. 50:14). The giving of thanks belongs with prayer and rejoicing as his will for us in Christ (1 Thes. 5:16-18). It is gratitude which calms the heart and makes loving relationships possible (Col. 3:14-15).

"Therefore, as you received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving" (Col. 2:6-7).

NAMES BY WHICH THEY WERE CALLED

The first time the word "Christian" appears in the Bible is in Acts 11:26. "They were called Christians first in

Antioch." This doesn't mean that this word was used each time a reference was made to the followers of Jesus. In fact, there are only two other times in the **B**ible that it is used (Acts 26:28; 1st Pet. 4:16). Sometimes they were simply called "disciples" (Acts 11:26); "believers" (Acts 5:14); "saints" (Phil. 1:1); "the faithful" (Eph. 1:1); "the brethren" (Gal. 1:2); and in Revelation 1:6 they are called "kings and priests." It is of interest to note that none but the word "Christian" is capitalized unless it was the first word in a sentence. Maybe there is a lesson in all of this. The Bible reveals that "God is no respecter of persons" (Acts 10:34; Rom. 2:11). It also reminds us that they (Christians) "had all things common" (Acts 2:44). The point of this article is to remind us that even the greatest of the Lord's servants were never given a title signifying a higher degree of their accomplishments. In most cases they were just called "brother or sister" (2nd Pet. 3:15; Rom. 16:1). There were some who fulfilled leadership qualifications who were called by the same word as their "office." For example - elders, deacons, pastors, overseers, bishops, etc., but even here

these were not of any major significance and were never used as proper titles. The Bible is God's handbook - may we
