

ALONE - AND YET - NEVER!

Today, when I am somewhat lonely and feeling a little blue, I remember a beautiful old hymn entitled, "No, Never Alone." The lyrics were written in 1897 by Ludie Carrington Day Pickett which included several stanzas all giving word pictures of beauty. But my memory now is limited to just the chorus which reads as

follows: "No, never alone, no, never alone. He promised never to leave me, never to leave me alone; No never alone, no never alone. He promised never to leave me, never to leave me alone." Maybe it was because these words were repeated in the chorus a couple of times or because I remember my mother singing them to me, but all down through the years they come back to me again and again.
