Evangelistic Atheism

I know, I know. The title of this article is a contradiction. To "evangelize," in whatever setting the term may be used, means nothing other than to announce good news. "Atheism," the claim that there is no God, means there is no good news to tell. These two terms obviously don't belong together.

But have you been paying attention? Atheist groups have been sponsoring billboards in cities across the country this holiday season. The huge signs are decorated like cards, but they proclaim announcements like "Heathen's Greetings" or "Yes, Virginia, There Is No God." This comes at the conclusion of a year in which we have heard of groups of unbelievers banding together for potlucks or family days. Sounds like "religious" fervor, doesn't it?

A few observations are in order. One is that people who declare themselves free from religion do not, merely for having done so, cease to have the human needs they have because they are made in the image of the God whom they deny. They need to belong. They need the affirmation of those who share their "faith." They need a cause to "believe in" and for which they may stand.

What, then, is the "good news" which the "freedom from religion" folks are so eager to hold forth? That you came from nowhere, mean nothing, and will cease to be. That the only meaning your life will have is what you choose to attach to it. That the lone standard to govern the use you make of it is whatever gives you the most pleasure. The "evangelistic" zeal of atheism arises from the devotion of the adherents to the sovereignty of their own preferences.

So the assumptions which have been underlying entertainment, academics and politics for so long—that we are the masters of the universe—now have to be announced on holiday signs. You may notice that they are aimed (in the minds of the sponsors) at Christianity. Can you imagine things like this being aimed at the popular imagination regarding Islam or Judaism? Have you wondered why?

At least in part, it's because we Christians insist that our hope has an objective basis in history. We believe in, and we present to the world, not merely a personal philosophy from within ourselves, but truth from outside ourselves which has been demonstrated in a Person. His presence is the ultimate challenge to the sovereignty of personal preference.

Evangelistic atheism is a reminder to us not to fall for the idea that we should not talk of our faith in public life. Unbelief is aggressive. We must be able and willing to speak of the Good News and why we believe it.



"OUT OF EGYPT HAVE I CALLED"

The land of Egypt, mentioned first in the book of Genesis and last in the Revelation, is a name used by the inspiration of God for many purposes in the Bible. The story of Joseph, one of the twelve sons of Jacob, is a case in point. As Joseph was sold by his brothers and became a victim of Egyptian slavery to his becoming governor of the land, one can see in this story the **power**, **protection and providence of God**. In Matthew 2:15, God had spoken to another Joseph in a dream and commanded him to take the young child, Jesus, into the land of Egypt in order to protect him from the jealous and wicked hand of King Herod. Joseph obeyed the voice of God. When the crisis was over, he again responds to God's command and returns to the city of Nazareth. There Jesus lived in safety during his childhood years. These are just two of the times God carried out his promise of taking care of His Children. However, the bottom line depends on our "hearing and believing" what God tells us through His Word.

God's calling His Son out of Egypt was in fulfillment of Hosea 11:I and can be called a "type" of our being called by the Gospel (2nd Thes. 2:14).
