Do you remember it? It all started when Jesus said to him, "Do you want to be healed?" (Jn. 5:6). That seems like an odd question, doesn't it? But when you think about it, it's intensely practical. So much of what we do find in life actually starts with what we want, with what it is we're looking for.

Answering that question would be a good place for each of us to start this year.



LATE FOR THE REHEARSAL?

"And when they were come, and had gathered the church together, they rehearsed had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith unto the Gentiles" (Acts 14:27). These words were written by Luke in describing an important gathering of the church in Jerusalem. It was to hear a report of Paul as he returned from his first missionary journey. Other translations may use words like "declared or reported." I especially like the older translation, at least for my purpose here. Its meaning: "engage in a rehearsal of." In other words, Paul was rehearsing what it took to bring salvation to the Gentile world. Gathering together was not uncommon with the first century church (See Heb. 10:15; Acts 20:7, 1st Cor. 16:1-2). If this particular gathering was to rehearse the success of Paul's missionary journey, is it not even more important that we hear for ourselves that same message which could make the difference in our eternal salvation? Then too, we must "gather" in order to worship God here in preparation of worshiping Him in heaven (Rev. 15:4). To that end we might say that our Lord's Day (and other days) of worship are but rehearsals preparing us for the continued worship of God in Heaven which is yet to come. Be careful - don't be late - these important rehearsals will make all the difference in the world - and heaven too!
