ONCE IN A BLUE MOON

When Lisa and I kept the grandkids over New Year's weekend, I wasn't sure what to expect. Sure, we had done a little babysitting on occasion, but this was our first time to bring them to our house - on our own - for three whole days (I thought you had to get security clearance for that.) Our children are all transitioning to their 30's now, so it has been over a decade since we had done much parenting and nearly a century since we had little ones. Reflecting back over our years of child rearing, I prepared myself mentally for the rigors of the weekend. Stiffening my resolve, I was determined to uphold strict discipline, the kind that builds strong character and good habits. Firm bedtimes should be observed. Healthy diets were a must. Before a child can get out another toy, he or she must neatly store the current one. One by one, I assembled my todo list (or to-don't list, depending on your perspective) and summoned all the fortitude I could muster to enforce it.

Then reality set in. Before we could walk in the house, Luke and Abby asked if we could make Easter eggs. I chortled at the request. Of course we could not dye eggs in December! But I had hardly unloaded the car before Grammie (alias Lisa) had the water boiling on the stove. And that was only the beginning of her efforts to undermine my grand plans. You might not believe this, but she let them get out Pirate Pop Up before putting up Pizza Pile Up. The very idea. At bedtime she thought it was a good idea to pull out Chutes and Ladders for one more game. And after hugs, prayers, and Bible stories, she had the brazenness to plug in a Jungle Book video as they drifted off to sleep. How could a woman certified in compliance - whose job it is to make sure doctors, nurses, and medical staff follow rules - behave in such a manner?? I thought about reporting this incident to her accrediting agency but I wasn't sure they had a confidentiality policy regarding whistle-blowers.

I was fully prepared to withstand the pleading eyes and impish grins of a 2 and 5 year old, but nothing prepared me for dealing with a 52 year-old grandmother. Maybe her behavior could be explained by the blue moon that appeared in the night sky that weekend. Or perhaps it was just the loving heart of a wise grandmother who knew the preciousness of the memories we were making. Training up children in the way they should go is about more than respect for authority and a good work ethic. It is also about grounding them in the joy of family love. Grandparents rejoice that the same man who wrote Proverbs 22:6 also wrote Ecclesiastes 3:1: *For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven* (ESV). 

"The Proof Of The Pudding"

Over the years I have learned that there is merit in many of the old sayings. Such is true with "the proof of the pudding is in the eating." Be aware that our Lord seeks to see the **PROOF** of our love for him. Consider the following scriptures: "And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may **PROVE** what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God" (Romans 12:2). "**PROVE** the sincerity of your love" (2nd Cor. 8:8). "**PROVE** your own selves" (2nd Cor. 13:5). "Let every man **PROVE** his own work" (Gal. 6:4). "**PROVE** all things" (1st Thes.5:21). These scriptures indicate that the Lord sees us and while we may say that we are his disciples, the **PROOF** can be seen by him in our actions. In the day of judgment the Lord will not accept us on the basis of our saying, "Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? And in thy name have cast out devils, etc. (Matt. 7:22)?
