About Our Work

What does our Lord want for, and from, his people? I've thought about that as I've reflected on our readings from Scripture these last few days. We've been with Job while he has endured the awful pressure of the prince of this world, and with Jesus as he tried to prepare his disciples to survive the approaching attacks of the same enemy. Under those circumstances, the great prayer of the Lord recorded in John 17 allows us to look in on his deepest desires for us. Here are the things we wants for us: 1) that we live for him in the world; 2) that we be set apart from the world by loyalty to the truth; 3) that we be kept from clutches of the evil one; 4) that we be one with each other as he is with the Father; 5) and that we may finally be with him to see his glory. Let us live like people who want the same things the Lord does.

Did you know the New Testament word for "salvation" is not merely a religious word? It was the term used for rescue from some danger, deliverance from some threatening situation, or being saved from some enemy. There have been several amazing examples of it in Haiti in the wake of the disastrous earthquake that country suffered. For example, fifteen days after the tragedy a teenage girl was pulled from the rubble alive! A kind of salvation was celebrated, but not as consequential as that which may belong to any one of us through the gospel: deliverance from the hopelessness of alienation from the One in whose image we were made, and from the ruin we have made of it. Thank the Lord for the kind of salvation he has brought for us!

I've seen members of this congregation quietly do some wonderfully generous things recently. Many have given to help with the overwhelming needs in Haiti. Thank you for your compassion. Others have worked behind the scenes to assist some of our families who have been experiencing hardship. The Bible says the Lord never overlooks such kindness. What a blessing to be around such good people!

Kay and I thank you for your concern for us over the last few weeks. We especially appreciate your understanding as we have tried to keep up with the schedule. Thank you for the cards and other thoughtful expressions of kindness.







"PARTAKERS OF THE DIVINE NATURE"

The apostle Peter informs us of one of the many blessings which we can have by being a faithful and dedicated child of God. "Whereby are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises: that by these ye might be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust" (2nd Peter 1:4). "The word for 'partakers' is literally 'sharers or partners' and points to the relationship which Christians sustain in the Lord" (Guy N. Woods). In other words, after becoming a Christian and having all our past sins washed away (Acts 22:16), we now, through living a righteous life, actually share in the divine nature of God. Living by the instructions which God gives us in His Word is like sharing a portion of God in our own life on earth. But the real beauty and joy of this promise extends to sharing eternity with Him when this life is over (1st Tim. 4:8). While God has made many promises to us here, yet can we begin to imagine how wonderful it will be as "partners" with God in that beautiful home of the soul which He purposed from the beginning (Eph. 3:11; Matt. 25:34)? By the same token, being "partners" with Him in heaven may be beyond the comprehension of some, but it is an extension of the Love which He will share with those in His spiritual family. (See 1st Cor. 2:9; Eph. 3:15). Yes - Dear God - HOW GREAT THOU ART!
