"THIS BEAUTIFUL LORD'S DAY"

I've heard the above phrase used in prayer with my brothers and sisters so regularly that it has become a part of my life that I treasure. There are some things about the Lord's Day that make it always beautiful: it means something comes first; it renews noble intentions; it reminds us of what has been given for us; it assures us that we are not alone; it refreshes our hope as we turn to the week ahead.

"On the Lord's Day" appears in Scripture only in Revelation 1:10, in connection with John's vision of the Living One, who, though he died, is alive forevermore. The use of the term in early Christian writings emphasizes that connection with his resurrection. Ignatius, for example, writing in the early part of the second century, described Christians as those who "have come to the possession of a new hope, no longer observing the Sabbath, but living in observance of the Lord's Day, on which also our life has sprung up again by Him and by His death" (Zondervan Encyclopedia of the Bible, 3, 965).

The first day of the week was regarded as the Lord's Day because it is the day upon which Jesus was raised up, as all four Gospels state. The Didache, a statement of Christian teaching also from early in the second century, advised, "But every Lord's day do ye gather yourselves together, and break bread, and give thanksgiving after having confessed your transgressions, that your sacrifice may be pure" (Ibid). Everett Ferguson, after surveying the writings of the first Christians, observed, "The day for the common assembly of the church was...the first day of the week....The references are numerous, unanimous, and unambiguous....Early Christian sources repeatedly connect the first day of the week with the resurrection. It is clear that it was this decisive event in salvation history which made that day 'the Lord's day.' The resurrection of Christ and his meeting with his disciples on this day provided the basis for Christians to assemble on the first day of the week. At that time the risen Christ was preeminently present with his followers" (Early Christians Speak, 71).

It is interesting that important things have always happened on the Lord's Day. Most of the appearances of the resurrected Christ of which we have a record occurred on the first day of the week. The Holy Spirit came and the church began on the first day of the week. The church then came together to remember the Lord and to devote themselves to him the first day of every week (Homer Hailey, Commentary on Revelation, 106-107).

With the Lord's people, for the Lord's Supper, on the Lord's Day. Beautiful!

WHAT IF THERE HADN'T BEEN AN ANTIOCH?

I think it goes without saying that most sincere bible students in thinking about the New Testament church, its purpose and the carrying out of its purpose would agree that the Apostle Paul's missionary journeys help us to see how this was accomplished. Also, his successes would not have been complete had it not been for the church in Antioch of Syria. It was from this strong Gentile church that this great man of God and others of his company were "sent out" (Acts 13:3). It was also to this good church that they always returned to report their success (Acts 14:27). There is a "point of fact" here that often goes unnoticed. Every missionary must have a strong base from which to operate. Now it is for sure that as Paul made his missionary journeys, there were times when he had to take care of himself (Acts 20:34). I contend that the silence of the total efforts of Antioch's spiritual support may be seen in the ways Paul taught. They must have had a good leadership base. As Paul reversed his tracks and came back into the regions of Pisidia and Iconium, the bible says that he "ordained them elders in every city." How did Paul know it was the Lord's will to appoint elders (leaders, bishop, shepherds) in every congregation? I suggest it was not only by the inspiration given to him by the Lord, but also the pattern which he saw in the well organized church at Antioch of Syria.
