You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. (Matt. 5:14)

STILL HOPING

We received a letter to the church from someone in another town in the area. It began, "Please pray for us now in the hour of our need. These pleas regard a life and death struggle ..." After listing several specific matters for which prayer was desired, the writer signed the note simply, "Still Hoping."

This serves to remind us that there are people around us who are indeed in the midst of weighty struggles. Some are carrying loads of care which are so severe that they test body, mind and spirit. Our Lord was able to "see" such individuals, and he was "moved with compassion" for those who were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd (Matt. 9:36). His people today must also have eyes that see, hearts that hurt, and hands that help. Compassion for those who are in the hour of need should be a big issue to us.

Realizing what others are going through has a way of helping us regain our own perspective. We can get so wrapped up in ourselves that the smallest of troubles looks huge. But what of those who are dealing with matters of life and death? What of those who must cope with abuse, family breakdown or financial ruin? Perhaps my problems are not so big after all. Maybe we are more blessed than we thought.

One of those blessings is the possession of what everyone is seeking: hope. Through the work of Christ, we have reason to expect that what is precious to us will be fulfilled. We have hope which is good (2 Thes. 1:6), blessed (Tit. 2:13), living (1 Pet. 1:3). That hope is the anchor of our souls, and it is something we must be passing along to people around us who so hunger for it. We have within our hands the gospel of hope. The world needs it.

Pray for all of us who are still hoping. Pray for those who need to be hoping and don't even know it. Pray for world conditions which will allow people to be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth.

THE SEED

By Dennis R. Smith Noah, a preacher of righteousness (2nd Peter 2:5), received a promise from God as the waters from the great

flood had dried up. Here is that promise: "While the earth remaineth, seedtime and harvest, and cold and heat, and summer and winter, and day and night shall not cease" (Gen. 8:22). That promise has been kept by God until this day. What would we do without THE SEED which continues to put bread on our tables and food in our mouths? While we are now talking about the physical seed, the same principle applies spiritually. Jesus, in explaining the meaning of the parable of the sower, gives us the secret of God's desire for humanity in all ages. "Now the parable is this: The SEED is the word of God" (Luke 8:11). With much care humanity has preserved THE SEED of many plants to insure that the next generation can also reap the benefits of a good harvest. If down through the ages the same effort had been made to preserve the spiritual SEED, the religious community would be a lot different today. There would not have been any need to name our places of worship for just mention of the name "the church" would be sufficient. In the first century there was only one. Wouldn't it be great if we could all plant just the seed of the Kingdom from that first century? We then could reap the harvest of only one name and unity among all!
