A CHRISTIAN AND HIS COUNTRY

This is the Lord's Day in all of creation and it is also Independence Day in the United States of America. As Christians who also have the privilege of living in this country, the fact that these two occasions coincide on this day is a good reason for us to consider how the one must impact the other.

What should a Christian's place in a country like this be? According to the scriptures, we have three basic obligations.

Be loyal to the Lord. No matter where he lives, a Christian is a Christian because he belongs to Christ and not because of his nationality. Patriotism and Christianity may both be noble, but they are not the same because one involves loyalty to a country while the other involves loyalty to the Lord. Every Christian bears in mind at all times that his citizenship is in heaven, even while he has his residence here (Phil. 3:20), and that he is thus bound to obey God rather than men (Acts 5:29). People can be Christians anywhere, whether in a Roman prison or in a Malawian village or in an American community.

Be a good citizen of the community. A man who lives with the conviction that God rules in the kingdom of men will be the best citizen in the kingdom of men. The beloved apostle wrote, "Let every person be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been instituted by God" (Rom. 13:1). In every way consistent with God's commands, Christians are to obey the laws of the land, pay their taxes, and honor their country. One who brings a Christian conscience into the community will be living in a manner which elevates that community.

Be praying for the responsible authorities. Christians are not only to help their country with their honorable conduct, but also with their intercessory prayers. The scriptures teach that we are to pray "for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way" (1 Tim. 2:2). Notice that this is not a selfish prayer for ease, but a petition for a setting in which people can "be saved and come to a knowledge of the truth" (1 Tim. 2:4). We who have the blessing of being in Christ and also living in this country ought to be deeply grateful for the freedom to serve our Lord in peace and quietness. This wonderful privilege, however, brings with it great responsibility.

This is a day to take joy in a land where the ideal is the right to the life, liberty, and pursuit of happiness with which each of us has been endowed by our Creator. More than that, it is a day in which to face the fact that these pursuits will not be fulfilled apart from our Lord.
