- 1. In the midst of a proud world, I lift up my eyes to the hand of the Lord for mercy. (Psalm 123)
- 2. If it had not been the Lord on my side, I would long since have fallen. (Psalm 124)
- 3. Trusting in the unchanging power and faithfulness of the Lord brings stability and security into my life. (Psalm 125)
- 4. I never stop needing the Lord to help me do my duty in the face of the problems of life. (Psalm 126)
- 5. I will rest in the Lord, for feverish, self-confident activity means nothing without Him. (Psalm 127)
- 6. When my reverence for God issues forth in obedience, it will bring the satisfaction I long for. (Psalm 128)
- 7. Trying to walk in His ways brings me face to face with my unworthiness, but with the Lord there is forgiveness, steadfast love and redemption. (Psalm 130)
- 8. Weaned from personal ambition by sin and forgiveness, my soul dwells quietly with God. (Psalm 131)
- 9. I am richly blessed to have so many fellow worshippers who share my precious faith. (Psalm 133)
- 10. I am going to give the Lord the praise He deserves. (Psalm 134)

A person who fills his heart with thoughts like these will have something to offer when he comes to worship. He will see it as a glad privilege (Psalm 122:1). It will fill him with a sense of well-being (Psalm 121:2). Let us then prepare our hearts for worship.

"Lord, When Saw We Thee?"

In Matthew 25 the divine writer gives us a picture of our Lord's expectations from all who would call themselves Christians. It is imperative that we "see Jesus" who is described as "The Son of God" (Matt. 16:16). In seeing him through the eye of faith, the next step is to obey him. This is done by making a the principles of selvation (Heb. 5:12). This includes faith repentance, confession of Christ and hentism for

response to the principles of salvation (Heb. 5:12). This includes faith, repentance, confession of Christ and baptism for the remission of sins (Acts 2:38). It is commendable when one sees Jesus this way. However, we cannot stop looking for him! The Matthew text informs us that there are other ways of seeing him. When we see those who are hungry, thirsty, naked, and in prison and make some effort to assist them in their needs, Jesus verifies that we have seen him. Of course, the other side of this coin is we see him not if we turn our heads to those in need and then let our opportunities "pass by on the other side" to use an expression from the parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10). The qualifications for heaven require that we "see the Lord" from all angles. The same thoughts are contained in the following: "Be not forgetful to entertain strangers: for thereby some have entertained angels unawares" (Heb. 13:2). If we make it to heaven, it will be because we have "seen Jesus" both in obedience as well as in service to others.
