MORE THAN CONQUEROERS

One of the most memorable and thrilling statements anywhere is Paul's declaration that "in all things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us" (Rom. 8:37). What a wonderful cry of victory.

Notice in particular the phrase "more than conquerors." It would be grand enough to be a conqueror, but through Christ we are more than that. We are literally "overconquerors."

But can anyone be more than a conqueror? G. Campbell Morgan observed, "We are more than conquerors when we take hold of the very things that threaten us, and transmute them into ministers of grace. We are conquerors when we defeat opposition; but if we are able to take hold of the opposing force, and turn it into that which helps instead of harms, we are more than conquerors." (Great Chapters of the Bible, p. 246)

In other words, in Christ we are more than conquerors because those things which seek to destroy our faith actually serve to strengthen it. For example, tribulation, which might otherwise have convinced us to give up the thought that the Lord cares for us, actually produces perseverance which in turn strengthens character and brightens hope (Rom. 5:2-4). What the adversary intended to press us down only serves to press us closer to the heart of God.

A faithful Christian is more than a conqueror. A conqueror might simply do away with trouble and hardship. But a Christian does something better. He endures all that the enemy holds against him, and allows that heap of conquered trials to lift him to greater levels of spiritual maturity.

Let us not be overwhelmed by what we face in life. "We are more than conquerors through Him that loved us!"



A REAL LOOK AT LIFE

In life there are no two people exactly alike. This shows the greatness of God in His creation. His patterns are never duplicated. Regardless of the difference in characters, there is ONE TRUTH that pertains to all someday it will end. In the meantime there are great similarities. Life begins with infancy, is followed by

carefree childhood, youth, middle age and then finally old age. This becomes a time when burdens weigh us down and when little problems rise to great heights. The Bible gives interesting observations on life but most tend to show the brevity thereof. "We are strangers before thee, and sojourners ... and there is none abiding" (1st Chro. 29:15). "We are but of yesterday, and know nothing, because our days upon earth are as a shadow" (Job 8:9). "Man that is born of a woman is of few days, and full of trouble. He cometh forth like a flower and is cut down; he fleeth also as a shadow and continueth not" (Job 14:1-2). While these things are true, today is the best time to take a real look at our own life. In the book of James we find the most startling of all descriptions: "Whereas ye know not what shall be on the morrow. For what is your life? It is even a vapour, that appeareth for a little time, and then vanisheth away" (James 4:14). Taking time to look at one's own life may be the most important thing we have to do - today!
