<u>"CAMP HOPE"</u> Bill McFarland

Anyone who could watch the Chilean miners emerge from deep in the earth, step out of the capsule, and be reunited with their loved ones without misty eyes certainly has an immovable heart! Think of it: thirty-three men, a half mile under ground, their families waiting at the surface of the mine, seventeen days before being discovered alive, sixty-nine or seventy days while the work of saving them was being done, and all brought out safe and sound. Wonderful! Such an amazing deliverance is worth celebrating!

Perhaps you noticed that the temporary community which sprang up around the mine, tents occupied by family members or fellow workers who would not leave the site, was referred to as "Camp Hope." We can understand why. How else could people wait and keep their spirits up and endure to the end? People who are faced with the stark realities of life cannot live without hope. It is an indispensable quality in overcoming any obstacle, staying with any relationship, and achieving any victory.

This is a perfect time for us to remember that *hope* is one of the key concepts of the faith of Christ. The God who loves us has given us "eternal comfort and good hope through grace" (2 Thes. 2:16). We have heard in the gospel of "the hope laid up for [us] in heaven" (Col. 1:5). Our hope is "blessed" (Tit. 2:13) and "living" (1 Pet. 1:3). Having been justified by his grace, we have "become heirs according to the hope of eternal life" (Tit. 3:7).

Not surprisingly, writers in the New Testament expect such a hope to have a huge impact upon the lives of Christians. We are in the process of being saved by hope (Rom. 8:24). Because of our hope we are to keep our souls anchored to heaven (Heb. 6:19), to purify ourselves (1 Jn. 3:3), to hold fast without wavering (Heb. 10:23), to serve steadfastly (1 Thes. 1:3), and to rejoice in all circumstances (Rom. 5:2).

We meet the practical responsibilities of daily life as people who are grateful for what God has done to qualify us to share in the inheritance of the saints. He has "delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son" (Col. 1:12-13). Redemption, the forgiveness of sins, is the most remarkable rescue of all!

It would not be out of place to say that a congregation of the Lord's people is a "camp of hope." We meet, we relate to each other, we deal with life, we work together for the sake of rescues, and we wait–all because we are a people who share a common hope.

#### Shoring up our Faith

While listening to Bro. McFarland's wonderful Sunday night sermon from the Book of Hebrews, words came to me which I first heard while serving in the Navy. They were the words "shore up." As it was used there, it meant to "prop up or patch up." Hours were spent in periodic drills with a special group selected to participate in readiness for any real damage if it ever occurred. They were called "the damage control party." Since a great part of Hebrews deals with the subject of faith, I think you will agree that often times we need to have our faith shored up. Even some of the Apostles of our Lord realized this as well (Luke 17:5). When Satan has blasted a hole in our spiritual ship of faith, we must immediately call for our own damage control party to shore up the damage. Since faith comes from hearing the Word of God (Rom. 10:17), it is necessary then to return more often to the Bible in order to find the reason for our own doubts and distresses. Prayer also is an experienced hand serving in our spiritual damage control party. When our love for Christ grows weak, when for deeper faith we seek, the beautiful garden of prayer awaits us, the worship and fellowship of our spiritual crew awaits us and even the Captain of our salvation (Heb. 2:10) will steer us back into more peaceful, quieter, and reassuring waters.
