#### The Urgent Issue for the Church: Godliness

Our beloved brother Paul wrote the first letter to Timothy, his true child in the faith, in the midst of pressing circumstances. His theme is how one ought to behave himself in the household of God, which is the church of the living God (1 Tim. 3:15). This, of course, is something every child of God wants to know.

What is striking in such a letter is the frequency with which the apostle turns our attention toward *godliness*. In fact, he brings it up eight times in 1 Timothy. His use of the term as he discusses the behavior of the family of God is thought-provoking because he employs it only two other times outside this letter, and it is used only four other times in the New Testament.

What does he mean by this word? "Godliness" has been described as the mixture of fear and love which constitutes true devotion to God. Its essential quality is the respect which wants above all to be well-pleasing to God. It implies goodness and holiness as a way of life, with an emphasis on the source of that lifestyle, which is a deep reverence for God.

Consider the prominence the practical pursuit of godliness is to have in life and thinking of the church.

- The object of our prayers for those in positions of civil authority is that we may lead godly lives (2:2).
- The effect of the entire Christian system is profound godliness–genuine humility, reverence before God, and worship of him in our lives (3:16).
- Our training and disciplining ourselves in the words of the faith and of the good doctrine must be in pursuit of godliness, not controversies (4:6-7).
- There is value in developing godliness because it holds promise both in this life and in the life to come (4:8).
- Sound teaching accords with godliness rather than puffing up with conceit (6:3).
- It is unhealthy to, in any way, treat godliness as if it were merely a means of gain or influence (6:5).
- Perhaps the greatest gain to be had in this life is godliness with contentment, for there is nothing else we can take out of the world (6:6-7).
- Godliness lies at the heart of what a man of God pursues with every fiber of his being; it is central to what he fights for and wants to take hold of (6:11-12).

*The burning issue for the church is godliness*. May we order our prayers, our priorities, and our practices accordingly.

Halloween is the season of the year when little folks dress up in various garbs and go from house to house seeking treats. It has not always been that mild. According to information obtained from the internet, the following brief explanation is given: "Halloween .... is a mix of ancient Celtic practices, Catholic and Roman religious rituals and European folk traditions that blended together over time to create the holiday we know today. Not wanting to take the excitement from little children as they adorn their favorite ghoul mask or Frankenstein cape, but should we have lived in Jerusalem on the day that Jesus Christ was crucified we might have witnessed something then that would make our Halloweens quite mild.
