

"GIVING ACCOUNT OF OURSELVES"

Jesus, in giving the great commission (Matt 28:19-20; Mark 16:15-16) not only informs Christians of the importance of sharing the gospel with all that we know and meet, but also reveals the absolute necessity which is placed on those who have heard the gospel and their willingness to respond or not to respond to it.
