Three Mistakes of Prayer

Prayer is the most necessary, constant, and personal spiritual discipline. It is humbling the heart before the throne of grace, casting all cares before the Father who cares, speaking gratitude for every good and perfect gift, requesting with simple trust the needs of the day, seeking wisdom and strength that responsibility may be met with honor, asking for blessings in behalf of struggling brothers or friends or neighbors, and walking with God all along the way. Prayer is not an *if* in a godly life, but a *when*—it is assumed.

But, when we pray the *how* is also important. Our Lord put an emphasis on this point when he taught about prayer in the Sermon on the Mount (Matt. 6:5-15). He addressed and corrected what are perhaps still the three most common mistakes we may make in our manner of praying.

Prayer to some audience other than God. There were, in Jesus' day, those among his own people who liked to pray so that they might be seen and admired by other people (Matt. 6:5). That was their motive, and—according to the Lord—that would also be the only answer to their prayers! True prayer, in whatever the circumstance of life may be, is trusting communication with the Father who sees in secret.

Prayer as a substitute for relationship with God. It is easy to "believe in prayer" instead of believing in the wise care of a loving Father; to rely on "the power of prayer" rather than upon the One who strengthens us. Our Lord dealt with this tendency when he spoke of Gentiles who heaped up empty phrases because they thought they would be heard for their many words (Matt. 6:8). Genuine prayer, he said, is communication with a Father who knows what we need before we ask. It is therefore more about our relationship with him than it is an exercise in getting what we want because we have performed well.

Prayer unaccompanied by intention to do what God is asked to do. If the first mistake is pride and the second is superstition, the problem here is insincerity. Our Lord offered a model of healthy prayer in which he instructed us to ask the Father to "forgive us our debts as we have forgiven our debtors" (Matt. 6:12). He went ahead to point out, though, that God can only answer this as one request: he cannot respond to a double mind (v. 14, 15). He can help our weakness where we intend to do what we should, but he will not help us be walking contradictions.

I believe that real prayer is the easiest thing, but the hardest thing, a Christian ever does.



"FALSIFYING" THE WORD "HUMBLED"

I open this article by referencing the following Old Testament passage: "Pride goeth before destruction, and a haughty spirit before a fall" (Prov. 16:18). It has been interesting to see how different words and phrases spring up so quickly, blossom and fall only to give way to a new set in a matter of time. Have you noticed the latest: "I am humbled." I observed this as a result of our recent election especially when a candidate has won and is giving his/her acceptance speech. Yes, this phrase is one of our latest. However, I wonder if those who have caught on to this phrase have their "humility" confused with their "pride." I once heard a preacher say that it is easy to talk of humility when everything is going good, when people are shouting our praises and when our bank balance is at an all-time high. Humbleness must indeed be the trademark of all of God's children. The Apostle Peter wrote, "Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, that he may exalt you in due time" (1st Peter 5:6). Paul wrote, "we must not think more highly of ourselves than we ought" (Rom. 12:3). Let us then be sure that we are not "falsifying" the word "humbled" by using this popular word when in fact we are, with pride, boasting of our own accomplishments. I write these things as a caution to all of us.
