#### About Our Work

We have used the little phrase above as the heading for articles in this newsletter many times down through the years. It is for a good reason, and it might be well for us to remind ourselves what that reason is. There is *work* to be done because the Lord has commissioned his church with the task of making him known through the gospel, becoming like him through teaching and worship, and caring for people through service and kindness. Her brothers and sisters here were present as her family remembered her, and served her family afterward, as Margaret did for many families for decades. That, friends, is what our work is all about. It is no small thing. It is about life.

Life is going on around us these few days. One family has been celebrating, but with tears. Another one of our families has been using our building to rejoice over marriage vows. Some of our members have been helping them. Later today, another of our families which is expecting their first little one will be "showered" as the rest of us rejoice with them. Through this next week, we are "adopting" the blood drive at the Community Blood Center, perhaps in so doing literally allowing life to continue for some neighbor. Most importantly, we are meeting today in the interest of that which is "life indeed" through worship and teaching and encouraging each other in the faith.

The times when things like these are going on all at once serve an important end. They, of all the moments of life, surely must lead us to examine what we are living for, why we are doing so, and how we would stand if called upon to give account. These are the moments that make me ask myself whether I am ready for life.





#### WHAT A FRIEND WE HAVE!

Recently I received a greeting card from a boyhood friend whom I had known since I was 5 years old. Since then, other than our high school days together, I had seen him probably less than five times in the 76 years of our friendship. I must confess that I was pleasantly pleased and surprised to receive his card. This set me to thinking of the real value of friendship and, you know, the Bible informs us of this so often. "A man that hath friends must show himself friendly; and there is a friend that sticketh closer than a brother" (Prov. 18:21). Another passage from the Proverbs adds further dimension to the richness of friendship: "A friend loveth at all times" (17:17). One more divine message if you please: "Thine own friend, and thy father's friend, forsake not" (Prov. 27:10). My suggestion concerning our friends is that we do all we possibly can to keep them. In light of all this, let me remind you of another friend who always stands by us in all the conditions which life brings. We sing of this friend and pray to God through this Friend and he leaves us a beautiful message as well as a promise when he said, "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:13). Of course, you know this friend did just that. He gave his life for us on a cruel cross that we could see the depth of his love and friendship.
