Coming Into Contact With The Blood of Christ

I'm sure that most everyone who has attended some kind of church service over the years has heard the expression "saved by the blood of Christ." However, how many have actually stopped to think just how do we come into contact with his blood? First in importance, we must know when it was that Jesus shed his blood. In John 19:34 as the Roman soldier came to break the legs of Jesus to hasten His death, he saw that Jesus was dead already. To make sure he "pierced his side, and forthwith came there out blood and water." It isn't any accident that later the Apostle Paul could write of such things as being "baptized into" the death of Christ (Rom. 6:3). In like fashion he also wrote "I am crucified with Christ" (Gal. 2:20). While we must admit that expressions like "washed in the blood" (Rev. 1:4) along with "we have redemption through his blood" (Eph. 1:7) are allegorical and are used spiritually, yet when we contact the spiritual with the scriptural it is easy to see that baptism by immersion symbolically represents the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus Christ (Rom. 6:3-5). This "form" (Rom. 6:17) not only represents the message of the gospel (1st Cor. 15:1-4) which has the power to save (Rom. 1:16), but it also equals in purpose what delivers us from the "power of darkness" and seals our "redemption through his blood" (Col. 1:13-14). No wonder the Bible talks so much about the necessity of baptism.
