INCREASE THE DEBT! Bill McFarland

No, not that kind! Not the kind of public debt that increases exponentially as political leaders view their success in terms of what new programs they can add, and as American citizens bemoan the deficits but are unwilling for anything to be subtracted from their own special interests. Not the kind of personal debt that burdens a life with anxiety and places a family at the mercy of whatever unexpected need lurks around the corner. None of us wants to see more financial debt; we wish for a more sound fiscal footing for our lives.

But we would be so blessed if we could be more aware of one kind of indebtedness. It is the sense of obligation our beloved brother Paul felt toward the cultured and the uncultured, the educated and the uneducated, so much so that he was eager to preach the gospel even in Rome (Rom. 1:14,15). He understood himself as a debtor because he remained aware that he had freely received what he could never have earned or deserved—the grace of life—and that as a result he had in his possession what all people everywhere need most. Could he, or anyone, have the right to receive such a gift but not to pass it along?

The debt that must increase is the kind that matures through gratitude and praise to the One who is owed. It is not a burden, but a delight arrived at by increasing appreciation. Dwelling on it leads one to exclaim, "Oh, the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are his judgments and how inscrutable his ways!" and to ask, "Who has given a gift to him that he might be repaid?" (Rom. 11:33, 35). A sense of indebtedness like this thinks not in terms of repayment, but of humble and joyful and grateful submission to the Giver, day after day, year after year.

The kind of debt of which we are thinking bears interest in terms of lives that are transformed through renewed minds. Any person who has been given life in Christ is indebted to live by the Spirit, not according to the flesh (Rom. 8:11-13). Individuals who are facing up to this debt will be seeking to fulfill the obligations of love (Rom. 13:8). Knowing they have come to share in spiritual blessings, they want to be a glad blessing to those who have brought them that privilege (Rom. 15:27). Even when slighted and trespassed against, this sense of indebtedness strengthens their heart: "and forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors," prays each one who knows his debt to Christ (Matt. 6:12).

Increase that kind of debt-at least our sense of it! The kind that fills us with grateful respect for God, motivates us to conduct ourselves with humble and joyful honor, and turns us into the most important blessings our neighbors have: bearers of good news!

Lord, help us to, in a healthy and scriptural way, face up to what debtors we are!



GOD SPEAKS THROUGH HIS SON

The best commentary on the Bible is the Bible itself. Without a knowledge of the Bible we fail to have the proper communication with our Heavenly Father. This thought can be seen in Hebrews 1:1-2: "God, who at various times and in different ways spoke in time past to the fathers by the prophets, has in these last days spoken to us by His Son, whom He has appointed heir of all things, through whom also He made the worlds." If we continue reading in verse 3, we will see that He upholds all things by the "word of His power." In other words the Bible is God's Revealed Message for our own dispensation. There was a time in which God spoke directly to His people. Understanding the importance of our need to receive the right message, the Apostle Paul commanded us today to "study to show ourselves approved unto God…" (2nd Tim. 2:15). There is power in the blood (Eph. 1:7) - the gospel is God's power unto salvation (Rom. 1:16) - there is power in prayer (James 5:16) - but without a knowledge of the Bible we would not even know of these great truths. You see, God's Son is also God's Word and God's Word is also God's Son (John 1:14). What great blessings God offers to us in the Holy Scriptures. After all, this is His way of communicating with us. Shake the dust off your Bible and let God speak to you daily through His Word.
