#### THE BEST THAT CAN BE SAID OF A PERSON

As I have been reading through Joshua this time, I have been struck by how frequently the phrase "Moses the servant of the LORD" occurs. By my count, Moses is spoken of this way thirteen times in the book. That description of him is further emphasized by at least five more references to Moses as either "his servant" or, when God himself is speaking, "my servant." In the immediate shadow of his life, it seems clear that we are to understand this as the most honorable thing that could be said of Moses.

It is noteworthy that a similar impression is gained as we read the things said about Jesus in the wake of his death and life. Peter said God had "glorified his servant Jesus" (Acts 3:13). In prayer to God, the apostles recalled the city gathered together against "your holy servant Jesus" and recognized the signs being performed through "your holy servant Jesus" (Acts 4:27, 30). The term they used for "servant" can also mean "child," but it is the word for the chosen servant whom Isaiah had promised (cf. Matt. 12:18). One of the most beautiful passages in the New Testament describes the exalted place he has for having taken "the form of a servant" (Phil. 2:7).

The connection between Moses and Jesus as, above all else, servants of God may help us understand why this is the best that can be said of a person. In his amazing defense of the faith as we have it in Acts 7, our beloved brother Stephen reminded his countrymen that when Moses had seen one of them being wronged and had defended the oppressed man, he supposed they would understand God was saving them by his hand, but they did not (v. 24-25). It turned out, though, that forty years later God sent the same Moses they had rejected to be their ruler and redeemer (v. 35). Stephen saw that pattern repeated in the costly but triumphant service of the Christ (v. 52).

Servants of God love him. They have come to do his will. They do not see themselves as being too good to attend to the lowliest tasks, or to bear with the most frustrating of people, or to endure the worst hardships. There is a meekness about servants that is not found in other persons (cf. Num. 12:3; Matt. 11:29). Humility and courage and loyalty through the whole journey are characteristic of them.

New Testament writers—including James and Jude, the Lord's half brothers—seem glad to refer to themselves as servants of Jesus Christ (James 1:1; Jude 1:1). It was their honor and privilege to be servants of the Servant God. That is our fondest dream, too. Our hope is in the day when he will say, "Well done, good and faithful servant..." (Matt. 25:21, 23).

Whose servant a person is will be the only thing about his life that will last.

#### "TAKE MY HAND, PRECIOUS LORD"

One of the most beautiful, promising and consoling songs is the one entitled "Take my Hand, Precious Lord" by Thomas Dorsey. The chorus goes like this: "Precious Lord, take my hand, lead me on, let me stand. I am tired, I am weak, I am worn. Through the storm, through the night, lead me on to the light. Take my hand, precious Lord, lead me home." It is the underlined part now to which I draw your attention. There are times in all our lives when we feel "tired, weak and worn." The human body is like a delicate machine and even though we are "wonderfully made" (Psalm 139:14), nonetheless it is physical and subject to weariness, wear and even death. Sometimes we feel perhaps like the whole world has tumbled down around us. I have been told that to some degree we each go through cycles in which these things are rather normal. However, our God understands our weaknesses and even gives us instructions on how to handle such if and when this might heavily occur with us. One of the most beautiful and inviting are the following words of Jesus: "Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn of me: for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light" (Matt. 11:28-30. Just remember, the Lord's hand is always extended to those who will reach out to Him.
