Consider This

Most of us are pretty well acquainted with the problems of worry, anxiety and discouragement. When such feelings trouble you, how do you respond? Do you consider giving up?

The scriptures give us something to consider during such times. To "consider" means to "learn thoroughly" from something. We can all be strengthened by taking this advice from inspired men.

1. <u>Consider God's Work in the Past</u>. Samuel encouraged Israel to serve God by telling them to "consider how great things he hath done for you" (1 Sam. 12:24). After all the wonderful acts of God in their behalf, how could they think of turning away from him? We also need to meditate upon what our Father has done for us through Christ.

2. <u>Consider Jesus</u>. Do we grow weary of the race set before us so that we are ready to drop out? Then let us "consider him that hath endured such gainsaying of sinners against himself" (Heb. 12:3). Jesus endured the cross! Surely we can endure our light afflictions which are for the moment.

3. <u>Consider the Birds and Flowers</u>. We are of more value than the birds, yet they have no anxiety over whether God will provide for them (Lk. 12:24). Think of how gloriously God clothes the lilies of the field without any worry on their part (Lk. 12:27). Surely our Father will provide for his children even more richly than he does the birds and flowers!

4. <u>Consider Your Brothers and Sisters</u>. One way to strengthen wavering hope is that we "consider one another to provoke unto love and good works" (Heb. 10:23,24). Rather than fretting over personal slights and worries, let us carefully think about what we can do to encourage each other in more love and good works.

5. <u>Consider the Latter End</u>. Do you question whether serving God is really worth it? Then take a moment to consider the latter end of those who ignore God (Ps. 73:17). The wise will take into account how things will turn out in the end, not how they look for the present (Deut. 32:29).

Each of these points from God's word contain precious truths which we need to learn thoroughly. They remind us of the real meaning of life and why it needs to be lived for the Lord.



What about The THIRD COMMAND?

Any good biblical scholar should know that the FIRST command is to *"love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind"* as he also should know that the SECOND command is *"to love thy neighbor as thyself"* (*Matt. 22:37-39*). However, in reading these verses casually, one might overlook what could be called the THIRD COMMAND. Notice again, *"Thou shall love thy neighbor AS THYSELF."* No, this verse is not telling us to be "struck" on ourselves or to *"think more highly of ourselves than we ought to think"* (*Rom. 12:3*), but it is telling us that we owe it to ourselves to talk to ourselves about the value of ourselves to the extent of wanting to save ourselves as much as we would want others to be saved. In the great and powerful message of Peter on Pentecost, he declared to the multitude *"save yourselves from this untoward (sinful) generation"* (*Acts 2:40*). Paul in his letter to the Philippians said, *"work out your own salvation with fear and trembling"* (2:12). The idea in both cases is not that anyone has the power to save themselves, but they do have power over their own decisions. Here is where the idea of the THIRD COMMAND comes in: If we loved ourselves as God loves us, we would then see the "profit" of saving our own souls (Matt. 16:26), thus making this our life's priority.
