THE SOBERING CASE OF KING SAUL

When we meet him, he is a tall, handsome, and apparently humble young man over whom the people come to rejoice greatly. But, what we remember him for is the way Samuel grieves over him, and the way God regrets making him king, and the way David flees from his jealous assaults. Some awareness of the factors which produce such a drastic downturn in the destiny of Saul is essential to our own spiritual health.

Both of the episodes that contribute to Saul's losing the kingdom involve failure in the service of God. In one case, Saul offers what he has no right to offer (1 Sam. 13:8f). In the other, he saves what he has no right to save (1 Sam. 15:1f). Each is indicative of the same flaw in his character.

Saul has a utilitarian approach to the things of God. He considers the offering of sacrifices, not as an expression of faithful devotion to the Lord, but as a means of holding his crowd together (1 Sam. 13:8). To him, the point is not to please God; it is to protect himself (1 Sam. 13:12). Religion is but a tool to be used in pursuit of the urgent needs of the moment.

Saul is therefore willing to do part of what God says. He will deal with the enemies, but spare their king. He will set apart what they have as an offering to the Lord, except what is good and best. He will sacrifice, but he will not obey (1 Sam. 15:22). He has no real interest in what delights the heart of God.

Saul reserves for himself the right to say which part, and when. His sin is presumption (1 Sam. 15:23). He sacrifices to God rather than to some idol, but he does it as if he himself is God!

Saul wants, however, that right without the responsibility. He credits choices to circumstances (1 Sam. 13:12) or to other people (1 Sam. 15:15). He becomes sorry for the consequences more than for the deed, and he is rejected (1 Sam. 15:20, 24f).

When our own life story is written, will what began with promise conclude with fulfillment or with disappointment? It will depend upon whether we take a different approach than king Saul did.

Service to the Bereaved

When it is learned that a family member has passed away, the family is called to see if they would like to have a meal prepared for them by the ladies of the church on the day of the funeral. If they do, it is accomplished by one of four groups serving in rotation. THE CHANGING OF THE GUARD

One of the many lessons taught in the Bible is that God has always had his watchmen to stand guard over his people. Ezekiel was given these instructions: "Son of man, I have made thee a watchman unto the house of Israel: therefore hear the word of my mouth, and give them warning from me" (Ezek. 3:17). From this reading I believe we could say that all Christians are appointed to be God's watchmen. In other words, they are to guard the people in the way they should go as well as to see that they carry out the commands given to them in "all things pertaining to life and godliness" (2nd Pet. 1:3; Heb. 13:17). In addition, with the changing of the guard there would be **standing orders** (Matt. 24:35) which had to be transferred to the oncoming watch. Here is where danger can occur. If these orders (the gospel) are not passed on, what will happen to the next generation. Tie this thought with "One generation passes away, and another generation cometh" (Eccl. 1:4). How dangerous it is to simply guess at what God wants with each new generation. It is critical that God's standing orders be carefully transmitted with the "changing of the guard." Respect for the outgoing generation must also be maintained and honored by the oncoming generation. Jeremiah put it this way: "Thus saith the LORD, Stand ye in the ways, and see, and ask for the old paths where is the good way, and walk therein, and he shall find rest for your souls" (Jer 6:16). Good advice I'd say!
