HOW THE RESURRECTION OF CHRIST IS TO BE HONORED

"But God raised him from the dead!" We always find that astonishing claim at the heart of the announcements and actions of the apostles of Christ (see, for example, Acts 2:24, 32; 3:15; 4:10; 5:30; 10:40; 13:30). That is as it should be. After all, it is the resurrection which declares our Lord to be the Son of God (Rom. 1:4), and which proves that what happened on the cross is a triumph over sin and death (Rev. 1:5, 18), and which assures that a day is fixed when he will judge the world in righteousness (Acts 17:31).

Almost instinctively, people know that if an event so meaningful occurred, it must be celebrated. We could not agree more. But another point seems obvious: those who announced the resurrection should be our guides in determining what to do about it. How, then, does their proclamation and practice indicate that the resurrection of Christ is to be honored?

When the Lord's Day is observed, his resurrection is celebrated. "The first day of the week" is the phrase that ties together the fact of the resurrection with the gatherings of the church (Lk. 24:1; Acts 20:7; 1 Cor. 11:20; 16:2). That we find his people meeting on this day tells us that the Lord wants his death remembered only in the light of his being raised up as the victor. The Lord's Day establishes the tone in our lives for each new week, reorienting our priorities and our behavior and our hope to the great truth of the gospel: "This Jesus God raised up."

When a scriptural baptism occurs, the resurrection of Christ is recognized and relied upon. In baptism according to the scriptures, one who dies to sin is buried by baptism into the death of Christ in order to be raised to new life as he was raised from the dead (Rom. 6:4). One who was dead in sin comes alive through forgiveness when he is "buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the powerful working of God, who raised him from the dead" (Col. 2:12-13).

When Christian character is being formed, the resurrection of Christ is honored. Some things belong to the old life, some to the new. Among those who have been raised with Christ, there is no place for such as this: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, covetousness, anger, wrath, malice, slander, obscene talk, or lying (Col. 3:5, 8-9). Instead, those for whom Christ is all are marked by new compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, patience, forbearance, forgiveness, love, peace, and thankfulness (Col. 3:12-15).

The resurrection of Jesus Christ is such an event as can only be celebrated by a whole life lived in view of it, not merely by a special day. These are three ingredients of such a life.

Lessons from a Dogwood Tree

Almost fifty years ago when I built my dream home in an alfalfa field, I also planted what was supposed to be a pink dogwood tree. It turned out to be white. Of course this didn't show up for almost a year until it put on its first blooms. I was somewhat disappointed but I thought, "the damage was done so I will just be content with the white one." As years went by, again I was disappointed when its trunk started showing signs of decay but each year in spite of the aging which had taken place, the old tree rewarded me with spreading branches of beautiful white blossoms. I had even thought of cutting it down many times, yet I just didn't have the heart to do so. Now, after all these years, there she still stands - somewhat snarled in places - but testifying to the strong heart within her decaying body. What lessons can I learn from my dogwood tree? (1) "Godliness with contentment is great gain" (1st Tim. 6:6). (2) "Fret not thyself to do evil" (Psa. 37:8). (3) "Be thankful (Col. 3:15). (4) Life, even in trees, is a product of God (Gen. 1:11). (5) Things are not always as bad as they may seem. (6) You can't judge a book by its cover. (7) Age is no excuse for quitting to serve. (8) There is nothing sweeter than little children, yet there is a certain dignity, says the Lord, in these words: "The hoary head is a crown of glory, if it be found in the way of righteousness" (Prov. 16:31). In summary - "And the trees of the field shall clap their hands" (Isa. 55:12).
