You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. (Matt. 5:14)

"YOU ARE SERVING THE LORD CHRIST."

"You are serving the Lord Christ" (Col. 3:24). This straightforward but profound statement is the heart of Paul's instruction to Christians who were facing the often difficult circumstance of slavery in the Roman world. It lays down a principle which is to continually, and in all kinds of settings, be before the Lord's people.

Here is our *privilege* as Christians. No matter what we do, no matter how common it may seem, we do it for Christ! What a high privilege it is to be a "vessel for honorable use...useful to the master of the house, ready for every good work" (2 Tim. 2:21). There couldn't be a more meaningful understanding of life.

Here is our *responsibility* as Christians. We are to respect the Lord Christ and act on the basis of what he says regardless of the situation. "If I were still trying to please man, I would not be a servant of Christ" (Gal. 1:10).

Here is our *enthusiasm* as Christians. Since we serve the Lord Christ, we want to do our best. The apostle says, "Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men" (Col. 3:23), and, "Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord" (Rom. 12:11).

Here is our *confidence* as Christians. We know that from the Lord we will receive the inheritance as our reward (Col. 3:24). Jesus said, "If anyone serves me, the Father will honor him" (Jn. 12:26).

Here is our *endurance* as Christians. We do not grow weary and quit because of frustration with ourselves or disagreements with others, for we are serving the Lord Christ. Nothing changes our loyalty to him.

One of the best things a believer can do in any circumstance is to remember that he is serving the Lord Christ. I can think of few other principles which have as much power to bless our lives.

THINGS... THINGS... AND... MORE THINGS

Have you ever thought of the importance of the English word "**things**?" When you stop to think about it, there are many different ways in which we use this word. For example: We all think we could not live without our "**things**" or gadgets. The longer we live the more we see "**new things**" coming on the scene. We are talking here about certain possessions which belong to us alone. Even the Bible makes use of this word. There are "**earthly things**" and then there are "**heavenly things**" (John 3:12). Also the Bible talks of "**things present and things to come**" (Rom. 8:38; 1st Cor. 3:22). Sometimes the Bible talks about deeds done as "**things**" (Rom. 2:1). Jesus used this word when he talked about where we place our emphasis. He said, "*But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these **THINGS** shall be added unto you*" (Matt 6:33 - read also 6:32, 34 for multiple uses thereof). **Point of fact** - We all have many "**things**" which we feel we just cannot live without. However, can we truthfully look at those "**things**" and in our heart and mind determine their importance? Our answer is most important! Again, Jesus said, "*For what is a man profited if he shall gain the whole world - **(with its things)** - and lose his own soul? or what shall a man give **(more things?)** in exchange for his soul?" (Matt. 16:26). Oh, by the way! When we are in Christ, he is able to make "**old things new**" (2nd Cor. 5:17). This includes our souls!*
