## THE WONDER OF A SEED

"Though I do not believe a plant will spring up where no seed has been, I have great faith in a seed. Convince me that you have a seed there, and I am prepared to expect wonders." – Henry David Thoreau

Lately I have seen a number of people prepared to expect wonders. Some of our friends here, for example. Rows have been laid off in a bare plot of tilled ground. They have been labeled. Stakes have been set up in preparation for growing plants and the resultant produce. All this, of course, is a work of faith in a seed.

The scriptures often use this very image to communicate the truth about life to us. The fact is that a seed is a wonder in the spiritual realm, too. The seed is what has life in it. Identity is bound up in the seed, and there is no fooling it: it will bring forth after its kind. There is also a harvest in any seed: the sower must be prepared to expect it. A particular seed may be tiny, but it has within it the capacity to become quite large and to bear fruit that touches many lives.

The seed of the kingdom of the Lord is his word. It is imperishable seed which produces new life that abides. Action motivated by it can be identified. Where it is being obeyed, good fruit develops and grows. That is the nature of the word of truth, the gospel.

Any kind of service in the Lord's kingdom may be likened to sowing seed. The sower realizes that seed has been supplied to him by grace. He sows it by using it for the sake of Christ. But he suffers no loss: the supplier of the seed increases the sower's harvest of righteousness!

The wonder of a seed is that it sprouts and grows. The sower doesn't have to know how. He just has to believe that it will, and to act accordingly.

Be prepared to expect a wonder. In due season we will reap, if we do not give up.





# **QUIT YOU LIKE MEN!**

The expression "quit you like men" has probably been the original source for a more current charge often made toward some. That expression is easily brought to mind by our own generation - "be a man about it." In the New Testament the Apostle Paul spoke these words to the church at Corinth in 1st Corinthians 16:13. On the other hand, it goes back much further than the New Testament. In 1st Samuel 4:9 the phrase appears as a rally cry to the Philistine army: "Be strong, and quit yourselves like men, O ye Philistines." As different translations have sprung up over the years, the "like men" has often been omitted and rightly so because in the kingdom of our Lord the word "men" is not always limited to the masculine gender. The term applies to both men and women and certainly fits in to all (at times) and means "quit acting like children" (1st Cor. 13:11). In both the texts it is very obvious that the idea of bravery, strength, and steadfastness is what the real message is. However, let us all be careful in our dealing with others that we cease to be "childish" about some things understanding that our Lord desires that we "grow up into him in all things, which is the head, even Christ" (Eph. 4:15). In the Christian world today it is even more important that we be brave and strong becoming great men and women not afraid to stand firm on and in the gospel of Christ. The Christian amour fits both men and women (Eph. 6:10-17)!
