FIVE MISTAKES THAT WILL MESS UP A LIFE

Proverbs 3:1-12 is a favorite passage of many, and deservedly so. It is the very personal appeal of a father to his boy. With the best interest of his son at heart, he wisely and lovingly offers the most beneficial counsel he has on how to make good use of life. In the process, he identifies the five mistakes any concerned father knows his boy or girl must avoid.

"Do not forget my teaching" (v. 1-2). The teaching being discussed here is the moral instruction that is handed down from one generation to another. What is at stake is not our memory, but our heart – our attitude toward the fundamentals of right living. It would be a mistake to betray the basic values imparted to us by those who love us most.

"Let not steadfast love and faithfulness forsake you" (v. 3-4). Don't let kindness and truth get away from you! Rather, let mercy and trustworthiness be deeply ingrained in your character. These two qualities will always be key ingredients in a good relationship with either God or man.

"Do not lean on your own understanding" (v. 5-6). Right before this phrase, the father advises, "Trust in the LORD with all your heart." Just after it he says, "In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths." The mistake would be to stubbornly pursue our own way, leaving a part-time place for God only in the crises that come along. We are to be conscious of our dependence on him at all times, and ever committed to his ways.

"Be not wise in your own eyes" (v. 7-10). If the error in the previous case is childish stubbornness, here the mistake is immature arrogance. It is to be combated by seeing ourselves in relation to God: compare your good to him; compare your hardship to his. Humility before him is the only appropriate mind-set. Humility will always be marked by a loving reverence for the LORD that turns away from evil, and by a grateful joy that honors him with the wealth he has given.

"Do not despise the LORD'S discipline" (v. 11-12). A life worth living will not always be easy. God, in his wise love, may allow us to endure adversity to train us or affliction to teach us. He is interested in our good, not momentarily, but afterwards; he works at shaping us into sharers of his character (cf. Heb. 12:4-11). It would be an awful mistake to reject this essential expression of his Fatherly love.

The wonderful paragraph before us says life can be filled with all kinds of blessings: length of days and years of life and peace, favor and good repute, straight paths and healing, refreshment and plenty, and family love. Any of the mistakes above, however, when persisted in, will mess up a life.

TEARS ARE A PART OF IT!

Based on the Holy Scriptures, I believe we can safely say that tears are a part of life. If life is a process of "many troubles" (Job. 14:1), surely this is one reason why our God created us with the ability to cry. There is a release from burdens when we can exercise this God-given ability. Yes, tears are a part of LIFE. They are a must at times in the life of Christian men and women. Don't forget that "Jesus wept" (John 11:35) in seeing the sorrow of Mary and Martha at the death of their brother, Lazarus! On another occasion, in thinking about the history of the city of Jerusalem, he "wept over it" (Luke 19:41). Christians at Rome were commanded to "weep with them that weep" (Rom. 12:15). The elders of the church at Ephesus "wept sore" at Paul's departing from them. Seeing that tears are a part of life, let me now make a few applications. If a Christian family has to move to another city, shouldn't we feel saddened at their leaving? Last, but not least, the need to weep over the lost souls of men: "They that sow in tears shall reap in joy. He that goeth forth and weepeth, bearing precious seed, shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, bringing his sheaves with him" (Psa. 126:5-6). Some day they will all be "wiped away" (Rev. 21:4).
