You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. (Matt. 5:14)

A Tree of Life

The tree of life is an important Bible theme. In the beginning of the Biblical account, fallen man is separated from the tree that was in the midst of Eden (Gen. 3:22). At the end of the record, redeemed man is restored to the tree at the throne of God (Rev. 22:2).

In between these two books, however, the phrase "tree of life" appears only in Proverbs. The wise man uses it to speak of things which are sources of the kind of life that a man ought to live. It symbolizes those qualities, which add beauty, joy and vitality to life.

1. Wisdom. The wise man said of wisdom, "She is a tree of life to those who lay hold of her; those who hold her fast are called blessed" (Prov. 3:18). Wisdom is not merely knowledge, but the proper use of knowledge. It comes from God (Js. 1:5), and it is pure, peaceable, gentle, easy to be entreated, full of mercy and good fruits, impartial and sincere (Js. 3:18). One who finds wisdom finds life and will obtain the favor of the Lord (Prov. 8:35).

2. The fruit of the righteous. "The fruit of the righteous is a tree of life, and whoever captures souls is wise" (Prov. 11:30). A good man's example and teaching is a source of blessing and life to others. His words and deeds are like the fruits of a tree which nourish many souls and lead them to God. Our lives ought to be filled with the fruits of righteousness through Christ (Phil. 1:11).

3. Hope fulfilled. The wise man observed, "Hope deferred makes the heart sick, but a desire fulfilled is a tree of life" (Prov. 13:12). Few things are as disheartening as dashed hopes. But when our deepest longings are met, it is as satisfying and refreshing to our spiritual lives as a tree of life. This is a blessing we always have in Christ, for our hope is sure and steadfast because of him (Heb. 6:19).

4. A gentle tongue. "A gentle tongue is a tree of life, but perverseness in it breaks the spirit" (Prov. 15:4). Harsh words have broken many a heart, but a gentle tongue has a healing influence. Wholesome words refresh and build up those who hear. Our speech ought to be a source of grace and encouragement to others (Eph. 4:29).

If you long for real life, seek wisdom, bear fruit, speak gently, and have a secure hope. These qualities will help us along the road until we finally come to the tree of life at the throne of God.

The Power of the Private Prayer

In that wonderful little Book of James, our Lord's Brother wrote, "*The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much*" (*James 5:16b*). The importance of prayer can be seen in the many passages which inform us of the need as well as necessity of praying and to do so often. The Apostle Paul said, "*pray without ceasing*" (1st Thess. 5:17). We are to pray in the public assembly, we are to pray for the sick, our leadership both in the church and for our country and for the world. These are all very, very important. In looking at our text it seems to suggest that the most effective prayer is that of our own private prayers. After all, it was Jesus who endorsed the need for the private prayer: "And when thou prayest, enter into thy closet, and when thou hast shut thy door, pray to the Father which is in secret; and thy Father which seeth in secret shall reward thee openly" (Matt. 6:6). This is not to say that all our prayers are in secret for there is always the need for families to pray together; husbands and wives to pray together and the need "to pray every where" (1st Tim. 2:8). However, may I suggest that the private prayer ranks very high in being the basis of a strong faith. Remember, "Without faith it is impossible to please God" (Heb. 11:6). While there are many other advantages in the private prayer, surely we know that God, through His Son, just likes to hear from us on a regular basis. (Requested by a dear Sister in Christ)
