### When a Christian Goes to School

All across our area, young men and young women have just stepped upon the stage for the next act in the drama of their formal education, or they soon will. It's an important time for everyone involved. School days bring their own special pressures, ranging from academic challenges, to the need to succeed socially, to demands upon schedules and finances. Only the passing of some years will reveal what a crucial role the choices made during these days play in the course of a life.

Anyone who considers the matter from a Christian perspective already realizes something of the profound significance of the educational process. One reason is that what you put into your mind may well set the tone for your whole life. Your mind is the part of you which reasons, thinks, and chooses—the part of you where the battle of life is really fought and where what you become is decided. Another reason is that your relationships with other people are likely to have a powerful influence on your life. We are social creatures, so it is natural to want to be liked and to seek friends and to try to fit in. It is when you are in the process of establishing your own self as a person that the opinions and standards of the people around you may impact you most. And a third reason is that when you are gaining education you are preparing for what you will do with the rest of your life. Who knows what doors of opportunity may be being unlocked or barred by what you do with these years of your life?

Make sure, then, that when you go to school, you take the following three principles with you. First, God is still God wherever you are, and he is to be loved and respected. He is no less present when you away from home, or in an academic setting. Steadfast love, justice, and righteousness are still more important than grades, athletic ability, or possessions. Keep your heart, soul, mind, and strength devoted to him, and keep your values, speech, and behavior fit for his presence.

Second, God's word is still the truth, and it is to be the authority and guide for our lives. It will always be right to do what the Lord says, and this will be the case no matter what kind of school you're in. Keep in mind that you never need to be afraid of anything that is true, but that truth is determined by the nature of God.

Third, God is still your Father, and you are to proceed like a child of his should. Be an imitator of God, as one of his beloved children, and walk in a manner worthy of your calling. It may be the case that not everyone else will be doing that, but don't be disillusioned; be your own best self. Keep trying to pursue excellence, honor, and dignity. Be considerate, decent, and kind.

After all, the whole point of education is to develop a person's life, and "the fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge."

### WHAT CAN WASH AWAY MY SINS? By Dennis R. Smith

What would the world be without singing? Suppose all of a sudden everyone and everything would lose the ability to sing? What if even the little birds also lost their sweet tunes on a spring-like morning? Well, it would be a sad world indeed - right? Now with that in mind, let us be more realistic! God has created us with the ability to sing, but the reason is more than just to be entertained. God has always required his people to sing in order to glorify him and also as one of the most successful tools in the teaching of his people. The Apostle Paul revealed this when he said, "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord" (Col. 3:16). As important as singing is, there is something about it that would be worse than the ability not to sing. It would be our not making any attempt to understand the meaning of the words. Just "mouthing" the words of a song accomplishes nothing in the sight of God. This can best be illustrated by using the old song "What Can Wash Away My Sins." Since singing praises is a process of "making melody in our hearts" (Eph. 5:19), for us to sing that beautiful old hymn without any concern for the blood of Christ as the redemption of our sins, we might as well not sing at all! This is why Paul said, "I will sing with the spirit, and I will sing with the understanding also" (1st Cor. 14:14).
