You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. (Matt. 5:14)

THE LORD OF THE STORM

The prospect of a hurricane making its way up the east coast of our country gets quite a lot of attention, doesn't it? And rightly so, given the power of such a storm and all the heavily populated areas near its path. As I have watched the news over the last few days, I've been thinking of my favorite of the accounts of the Lord's miracles—the time when he turned a great tempest into a great calm.

It is vividly described in Mark 4:35-41, and what a scene it is! A very busy day had passed into evening and, at the instruction of Jesus, the disciples were making the trip to the other side of the sea. While he slept on a cushion in the stern of the boat, the disciples suddenly found themselves in the grip of a windstorm that shook the sea like an earthquake. The waves were breaking into the boat, filling it with water, and their lives were quickly in jeopardy! Realizing the danger, the frightened disciples awakened the Lord with their cry, "Do you not care that we are perishing?" He simply rebuked the wind and told the sea to be still. Immediately, there was a great calm in nature and a great fear in those men!

Think of the lasting lessons from this unforgettable scene. The first has to do with the nature of the Lord's authority. Here's what struck the disciples: "even wind and sea obey him!" He was exercising the power of the Ruler of heaven and earth (cf. Ps.89:8-9; 93:3-4; etc.). This mighty work was done not only to deliver them from danger but also to confirm the authority of his words. We should learn that his right to speak and be obeyed extends to all areas of our lives (Matt. 28:18-20). The authority of the Lord is our friend, not a dreaded limitation.

Another truth from this event that should stay with us is the blessing of the Lord's presence. They awoke him with their cry, "Save us, Lord, we perish!" What a good thing it was that he was there to turn to. He always is with his people this way, for he has promised, "I will never leave you nor forsake you" (Heb. 13:5). One thing, though: you need him in the boat with you. You don't wait until you're sinking and then go get him.

A third thing about this event to consider is the nature of the Lord's care. The disciples are proof that storms can fall upon you while you are doing what he said to do. It can appear that he is not doing anything about it; he's not paying attention. But he calls us to believe in him even when fear challenges our faith. Remember: the boat won't sink, and the storm won't last forever.

If he can still the storm, he can still our lives. If the winds and the waves obeyed his will, surely we should obey him. If he was trustworthy in a sinking boat, he can be trusted in everyday life.

DENYING ONE'S OWN INTELLIGENCE

The Bible informs us that when God created man he made him "in his own image" (Gen. 1:26). This surely means that mankind has been blessed with intelligence enough to believe and accept God and to be able to understand his word. But when one denies the authenticity of the Holy Bible claiming he cannot understand it and that no one else could either, he is denying a power source which God gave him even at birth. The body is "fearfully and wonderfully made" (Psa. 139:14). This means that we do have the necessary intelligence to understand God and his word. To be more frank about it, we all have the resources to understand the Bible if we first have the desire and then be willing to spend the necessary time to read and meditate upon it. The Apostle Paul put it this way: "Wherefore be ye not unwise, but understanding what the will of the Lord is" (Eph. 5:17). It will take time and effort but when one has the same desire as the Psalmist who said, "Oh, how love I thy law" (Psa. 119:97), rest assured God will bless him with the tools to be successful. If and when we will "Search the Scriptures" as Christ has commanded (John 5:39), we will soon reach the place where we will never doubt our ability to understand them. Until then, for us to say we cannot understand the Bible, it not only is an excuse but also a denial of one's own intelligence.
