DRAWING THE LINE

Drawing the line is an old expression meaning "this is as far as I am going." Sometime you might also hear some say "I will go so far with you, but I'll have to draw the line somewhere." Maybe you can best understand what I'm talking about with this quote from the Book of Joshua: "And if it seem evil unto you to serve the Lord, CHOOSE you this day whom ye will serve; whether the gods which our fathers served that were on the other side of the flood, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land ye dwell: but as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord" (Joshua 24:15). It is interesting to see how that God lays down his instructions in regard to the type of life he wants us to live, but always leaves it up to us to abide or not to abide with him. God never forces anything upon us. By the same token he has created us with this thing called our conscience which is defined as "a person's moral sense of right and wrong." While conscience alone (without the word of God) is not always the best course of action, in most cases it will serve one well. When one knows what God wants of him and violates his conscience - "to him it is sin" (James 4:17). What then is the best policy? Stay within the bounds of God's word and draw your line there. It will be the BEST CHOICE that you could ever make!
