About Our Work

By the nature of my work I am sometimes in a position to know of kind and generous things my brothers and sisters quietly do. On their on and without notice, there are always some whose deeds are beautiful expressions of their love for the Lord and their membership in his body. I am always impressed with how much this happens during this time of the year. The doers of whom I am speaking do not call for the cameras nor do they post lists of their beneficiaries on social media, but I assure you they are present and they are blessing lives. Their actions are for the Father who sees in secret and their reward will come from him (Matt. 6:4). I am so thankful for the goodness of my brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Copies of our daily Bible reading plan for the new year are available for you to pick up now. Our interest, of course, is simply to encourage everyone to read the scriptures, and we make a schedule available toward that end. It's a quite different approach this time. It will still take us all the way through the Bible during the year. This time, though, it is more topical in the sense that it is basically three chapters each day, but from different parts of the Bible. We are not reading entire books straight through this time, and we may miss that continuity a little. But trying it this way will have some advantages: 1) Readers will be less likely to get bogged down in some section and give up. 2) A variety of spiritual needs will be addressed each week. 3) We won't be waiting until October to get any of the New Testament. 4) Any of us who get behind can jump back in at any particular time. 5) There will be an opportunity each day to identify a new theme and to meditate on it. 6) The fact that this is a different plan may help to motivate us and to keep our attention. Be sure to get hold of your copy and be ready to enjoy the adventure with us!

We realize these next two weeks will be busy—and hopefully especially beneficial—ones for our families. We expect that there will be trips and gatherings and quiet times for many of us. We are praying that all of us will keep ourselves physically, socially, emotionally, and spiritually well, and that we will come out of the holiday season refreshed and renewed.

For our all-congregational activities, we are going to be keeping our usual schedule. We understand that some will be away, and we will take the circumstances into account when we meet for classes and on Sunday evening. When the whole church comes together on the Lord's Day, we expect that each one of the Lord's people will want to be present to remember him. On Wednesday evening the twenty-eighth, instead of having our classes we will all be together in the auditorium for a year-end devotional time.

Please help us watch out for one another during this time. May we remember each other in our prayers.

A BRIEF EXPLANATION OF OUR PLEA - Part Two

The church of Christ, scripturally and spiritually speaking, is the body of Christ. Notice the following passages: "And what is the exceeding greatness of his power to us-ward who believe, according to the working of his mighty power, Which he wrought in Christ, when he raised him from the dead, and set him at his own right hand in the heavenly places, Far above all principality, and power, and might, and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this world, but also in that which is to come: And hath put all things under his feet, and gave him to be the head over all things to the church, **Which is his body**, the fulness of him that filleth all in all" (Eph. 1:19-23; See also Col. 1:17-18). In simple language this means that when one understands and accepts these words as being true, it gives a completely different picture of most people's concept of the church. In other words when we disgrace the church, we are disgracing Jesus Christ. When we respond to the teaching of the scriptures concerning the terms of admission into the church, we are responding to the will of Jesus Christ. This line of thought applies in all that the Bible teaches concerning the church. We cannot separate Christ from the church and be pleasing unto him. If we believe the Bible, we must believe this also. Another thing: If salvation lies in Jesus (John 14:6), then it is secured and maintained by the church which the Bible says "IS HIS BODY."
