Window Fighting

I sat down to write about something else but I was soon interrupted by an unusual racket at my window. The sound startled me a little, and I looked up quickly. There in front of me was a robin frantically fighting his own reflection in the glass. It is the springtime and, acting by instinct rather than by reason, he was apparently engaged in guarding his territory and seeking a mate. Undoubtedly he thought he was taking on a rival, but he was only struggling against himself-and getting nowhere.

That bird is not the only one of God's creatures to have ever spent his energies in window fighting. I have done it myself more than a few times, and perhaps you have, too. We react to appearances and, without thinking things through enough to see if there is really an adversary there, we jump to a conclusion and fly to a battle. Though it exhausts us, is not worthy of us, and accomplishes nothing, we cannot drop it and direct our attention to the real issues of life. And as with my view of the robin, it is easier to see when someone else is engaged in this futile business than it is to recognize that we are doing it ourselves.

Window fighting may take one of several forms in our lives. Often we struggle against ourselves, rather than understanding, accepting, and devoting ourselves to the goals we were made to seek. Frequently we assume some relatively small offense in the words or actions or inactions of someone around us, then wrestle indignantly against that slight. After all, that is easier than having to confront the great issues of life. Sometimes, when you get right to the bottom of it, we are resisting what we know the will of God is. That is the most futile and destructive window fighting of all.

The God in whose image we are made created us for a fight that is worthy of our being. He has given us a purpose which deserves our most careful thought, our very best effort, and our most loving devotion. He has designed us in such a manner than we may find fulfillment in this pursuit, though it will occupy our hearts for a lifetime and though it will require every fiber of our being.

The Bible calls it "the good fight of the faith" (1 Tim. 6:12). It is a struggle against all the spiritual forces of evil (Eph. 6:12), and for the truth of the gospel (Gal. 2:5). One engaged in it is seeking to lay hold of the eternal life to which we have been called and about which every Christian has made the good confession (1 Tim. 6:12). Such a one desires to come to the time of his departure able to say, "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith" (2 Tim. 4:7).

That is a fight worth fighting.
