### <u>The Practical Resurrection</u>

Something strikes me as I read James. The writer is believed to be James the Lord's brother–well, half brother. He is also the brother of the writer of Jude, and sometimes you will find him referred to as James the Just. As he writes, he is a pillar of the church in Jerusalem, a man whose wisdom is respected and whose humility is obvious in the reading of his words (cf. 1:1; Acts 15:13f).

But he hasn't always been this way. There was a time when neither he nor his other three brothers believed in Jesus (Jn. 7:5). At one point James, along with the other family members, thought Jesus was beside himself—that he had lost his senses (Mk. 3:20, 21). As he writes this letter, though, he identifies himself simply as "a servant of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ."

What changed everything for James? One important factor would seem to be the "then he appeared to James" in Paul's list of the post-resurrection appearances of the Lord (1 Cor. 15:7). The details of that meeting are not provided for us, but the fact that it happened explains why James came to have a central role in the Jerusalem church (cf. Acts 12:17; 21:18).

And that, to me, is one of the interesting things about the Letter of James. As profound as the impact of his having seen Christ after he was raised up must have been on James, I don't find him making any direct mention of the resurrection in his epistle. Instead, James writes about what the practical impact must be, assuming that Jesus is Lord.

The issue, to James, is how we are now to live every day. He is interested in reallife faith, the actual doing of the word. He calls upon us to control our tongues, to be pure in temptations and patient in trials, to be fair and kind to people, and to be humble and wise before God. He is known for his call for "pure and undefiled religion."

Maybe the reason is that James is clear in his own mind about the "what if Jesus has been raised up" question. He refers to Jesus as "the Lord of glory" (2:1), and points out that "there is only one lawgiver and judge, he who is able to save and to destroy" (4:12). "The coming of the Lord" is the event worth waiting for, he says, the reality for which all must be prepared (5:7, 8). He wants us to treat each other as if we know that "the Judge is standing at the door" (5:9).

James cannot think of the living Lord without remembering that we are accountable to him in the most practical ways. Neither should we.

QUESTIONS CONNECTED WITH CONVERSIONS By Dennis R. Smith
