# Things That Are Precious

Of all our needs, none is more pressing than our need for a better sense of values. Too many of us neglect the most priceless treasures to seek after worthless trinkets. Rather than pursuing things of eternal value, people are trading life and soul for fleeting goods and pleasures.

We ought to put things that are really precious first! In the Bible the word "precious" means "costly, dear, very expensive, of great value." Think of some of the things the inspired writers described with this important word:

- 1. The precious blood of Christ. It is not with perishable things like silver or gold that we are redeemed from an empty way of life, "but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot" (1 Peter 1:19). No more costly price was ever paid than that by which God redeemed us. We need to be putting Him first and living for His precious Son!
- 2. The precious faith of Christ. Peter wrote "to those who have obtained a faith of equal standing with ours by the righteousness of our God and Savior Jesus Christ" (2 Peter 1:1). Faith which endures the trials of life is "more precious than gold that perishes though it is tested by fire" (1 Peter 1:7). Money, pleasure and fame will fade away, but faith will be "found to result in praise and glory and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ." Don't give up the faith for the useless things of this world!
- 3. The precious promises of God. Through Christ, God "has granted to us his precious and very great promises, so that through them you may become partakers of the divine nature, having escaped from the corruption that is in the world because of sinful desire." (2 Peter 1:4). On the day of death nothing will be of more value than the precious promises of God. However, we will not be able to lean upon those great promises unless we have regarded them as precious during our lives. We must lay up treasures in heaven now while we have opportunity!

Nothing tells more about the heart of a man than what he holds to be precious. Jesus said, "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:21). Let's make sure our lives are centered upon things that are precious.

#### WHAT IS BETTER THAN SMELLING THE ROSES?

Surely we have all heard the old expression, "better stop and smell the roses." This, of course, has reference to the thought of slowing down and quit pushing life for things that really are not all that important. That is good advice, but there is something that precedes our doing so which is more important by far in the long run. To answer this question I will refer you to Psalm 46:10: "Be still, and know that I am God." In the most part the rose is a symbol of love and beauty. Many songs have been written about the rose and then there's the famous quote by Shakespeare, "A Rose by any other name would smell as sweet." As far as I can tell there are only two times in the Bible where the rose is mentioned. They are as follows: "... and the desert shall rejoice, and blossom as the rose (Isa. 35:1). ...I am the rose of Sharon, and the lily of the valleys" (Song of Sol. 2:1). Both of these are metaphors relating either directly or indirectly to Jesus himself or the peace and serenity of his kingdom. Now, what is better than smelling the roses? The answer is to stop and acknowledge that the God of heaven, who is the creator of all things, has brought the rose into being and many other beautiful things which we enjoy. While it might help us to stop and view all these things, it is better that we understand "all things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made" (John 1:3). The first order of business then is to "be still and know God."
