

THE CATTLE UPON A THOUSAND HILLS

While the Fiftieth Psalm, in the main, describes the majesty of God, it also shows the sufficiency of God. It was addressed to Israel of old for the purpose of rebuking them for the routine of their worship to him. It seems that the purpose of the various sacrifices which God had commanded them to make was being offered as if God was in need instead of their knowing that it was a reminder of the covenant which he had made with them. The 10th verse is a beautiful expression of what God owns. "For every beast of the forest is mine, and the cattle upon a thousand hills." This paints a beautiful picture of the abundance of God. Cattle, being mentioned in scripture, usually means wealth; the more cattle one owned reflected on his riches. In this case the psalmist is making a distinction between the "domestic" and the wild. They all belonged to him. In verses 11 and 12 God again tells Israel that the whole world belonged to him. How can this beautiful psalm teach us a lesson for today? It is simple! God owns it all! We may work and labor and seek to have great wealth and in so doing completely forget that God owns everything and he has only allowed us to be the stewards thereof. Without God in our lives we labor in vain. In the book of Job (1:21) we can see the futility of laboring without God. "…the Lord gave, and the Lord hath taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord." Really, the thing which God wants the most - is our life!

The Church Family

In light of the lesson last Sunday evening, thinking of the church as God's family, I thought the following was an eloquent and beautiful picture of "church" should be. (Adam)

Congregational fellowship is...most comforting. It is comforting because it embodies the koinonia fellowship of caring and sharing at the most personal and intimate level. It is family. The immediate family.

Congregational fellowship is God's sublime answer to Cheers, "where everybody knows your name." No, not people whose emptiness is filled by nothing more than beer and banter, but people who worship together, pray together, study together, eat together, laugh together, cry together.

The local congregation is a spiritual "Neighborhood Watch." We look out for one another. We protect each other. Pull for each other. Encourage each other. Remind each other. And, if need be, rebuke each other.

Both physically and spiritually, God put us in families for a purpose. Somebody has to know us, warts and all. Somebody has to love us, warts and all. Week in and week out. Year in and year out. Mistake in and mistake out.

Congregational fellowship may not be "till death do us part," but it certainly encompasses "in sickness and in health." It means pot lucks for the healthy and bowls of soup for the sick. It means hospitality in the home, prayers in the hospital, sympathy at the graveside, and hugs whenever we need them.

Congregational fellowship is God's answer for loneliness. It is his way of telling us day in and day out that we are loved. That we have brothers and sisters who think we are important. And that they, in turn, are important to us. The best antidote to loneliness is not being served but serving; and congregational fellowship is tailor-made for having people to serve.

In the immediate family of a local congregation, even single Christians can share in the joys of being with children. And older folks can be "grandparents," whether or not they have grandchildren of their own. For those who are far away from their physical families, the church family near at hand is a serendipity of faith. Need a family? Find one in your local congregation.
