"WHOEVER..."

It isn't uncommon to hear someone say "whatever..." in some passing conversation. It is a response meant to indicate indifference toward the matters being discussed. Maybe that is one reason why another term has caught my attention this past week—one that is used several times in our Bible readings. It is "whoever." As the first word in several statements, "whoever" initiates the ideas expressed so as to emphasize that these are truths which have significance to all persons, everywhere and all the time.

The Proverbs we have read use "whoever..." to call our attention to how life works. These are general rules which cannot be evaded by human irresponsibility nor escaped by human ingenuity. They are just how things are. Here are some examples from the passages we have read over the last few days.

- 20:1 "Wine is a mocker, strong drink a brawler, and whoever is led astray by it is not wise." (And, as the alternate rendering indicates, he "will not become wise.")
- 20:19 "Whoever goes about slandering reveals secrets; therefore do not associate with a simple babbler." (The footnote observes that "with a simple babbler" could be translated "with one who is simple in his lips"—that is, thoughtless in what he says.)
- 21:13 "Whoever closes his ear to the cry of the poor will himself call out and not be answered."
- 21:17 "Whoever loves pleasure will be a poor man; he who loves wine and oil will not be rich."
- 21:21 "Whoever pursues righteousness and kindness will find life, righteousness, and honor."
- 21:23 "Whoever keeps his mouth and his tongue keeps himself out of trouble." These are Wisdom's observations on human experience. In each case there is much food for thought for anyone who would discern the difference between right and wrong.

But where would we be without the way the Gospel of John uses "whoever"? John uses the term to emphasize that each of us matters to God, and that he has done something through his Son to remedy our shortcomings where "whoever" in the Proverbs is concerned. Notice these cases.

- 3:16 "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." (Verse 36 indicates that the "believing" contemplated has the habit of "obeying" the Son.)
- 6:35 "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me shall not hunger, and whoever believes in me shall never thirst."
- 8:12 "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."

There are, of course, other great examples of this usage in John. These are enough, though, to make any thinking person grateful to be a "whoever" with a life to live that God values.

What beautiful words our Lord has given to us in Matthew 11:28-30: "Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." While much could be said about the different "parts" of these promising passages, I would invite our readers to center their thoughts on the words concerning the "rest" which Jesus mentions in verse 28.
