

### **One Thing**

"O, Martha, Martha," Jesus said (Luke 10:41). Every time I read the story, my mind runs immediately to my childhood, and begins to recite, "Marsha, Marsha, Marsha!" Those mocking words are, of course, those made famous by the young Jan Brady of *The Brady Bunch*, as Jan was jealous of Marsha for garnering so much attention at a party. Jesus (no sibling jealousy involved here) made His statement, not in *complaint*, but in *correction* of Martha. "Martha, Martha, you are worried and troubled about *many things*. But *one thing* is needed, and Mary has chosen that good part, which will not be taken away from her" (Luke 10:41-42, emp. added).

You'll remember that, in the story, Jesus was invited for a meal at the house of Martha, Mary and Lazarus. As they were waiting together, Mary was sitting at the feet of Jesus listening to Him teach, while Martha was busy getting things ready to serve. She almost borders on rebuking Jesus, asking Him, "Lord, do You not care that my sister has left me all alone to serve? Tell her to help me!" (Luke 10:40). That statement prompted Jesus' delicate, but firm, rebuke of Martha, and praise for Mary's choice. Her priorities were a little mixed up; she thought her duties (though they were important) took precedence over the things with which Mary concerned herself. Jesus' lesson was of the priority of spiritual things over the physical.

You know, Jesus' words could just as well be repeated today, with just a change in the direction of the rebuke: "O, Adam, Adam...you get so caught up in the *many things* of life, that you forget the *one thing* that is most important...Me." Couldn't you probably hear those words sometimes as well? In a nation where every day is characterized by the fast paced, "run-all-day" lifestyle, it can be easy to go even a whole day without stopping to take time to consider the One who has given us the day.

Today, and everyday, in the midst of our Ozark Mountain "rat-race," take time to stop and pray... to meditate... to offer praise... to open your Bible... to smile... to give thanks... to marvel at God's beauty... to share love with someone... to be a blessing... to give glory to the One who makes life worth living. Jesus was right. Those many things which distract us every day will one day not mean a thing. But that *One Thing* can never be taken from us. Praise God for that!



### BUT HE THAT LACKETH THESE THINGS

While God is a merciful God full of grace and concern for his people, yet he is also a God who loves us so much that he is not above correcting and warning us of impending dangers. To verify this statement let us go first to Hebrews 12:6 where we find, "for whom the Lord loveth he chasteneth, and scourgeth every son whom he receiveth." Next, let us go to 2<sup>nd</sup> Peter 1:9 where the following warning is given. "But he that lacketh these things is blind, and cannot see afar off, and hath forgotten that he was purged from his old sins." This last passage falls on the heels of what has long been called "The Christian Graces." This is that section of Peter's 2<sup>nd</sup> letter where he identifies the attributes of a Christian. In short the Christian must be one who continues daily to add to his faith such things as diligence, virtue, knowledge, temperance, patience and godliness. The warning comes in that 9th verse where these startling words will again be repeated for emphasis: "But he that lacketh these things." The second letter of Peter can be described as an epistle on remembering. In this case we must remember him who saved us by his grace and then start immediately to add those graces to our lives. If we fail, the "flip side" of verse 10 reminds us that we will fall. Fall from what? It clearly means that we have "fallen from grace." The end result of this is seen in chapter 2 where he reminds us that "The latter end is worse with them than the beginning" (2<sup>nd</sup> Pet. 2:20). (Something that we must all consider!).
