### I Dare You...!

Everyone has heard those words, most likely when we were young. "I dare you to throw that rock through that window," your friend Johnny may have said. Or, "I dare you to jump out of that tree." They were challenges laid out in front of us, begging us to try them, humiliation waiting if we didn't accept. So, we often followed through, right? And what did we get out of it? Usually nothing, and sometimes paid the consequences for going through with it.

Read Malachi 3, and see if this challenge from God resembles what Johnny might have said to you as a kid. "'Try Me now in this,' says the Lord of hosts..." (Mal. 3:10). "Do it! I dare you! Put me to the test," God said to the people. What is the difference between God's dare and Johnny's? When you received nothing for following the childhood dare, what do you gain from God's? "'Try me now in this' says the Lord of hosts, 'If I will not open up for you the windows of heaven and pour out for you such a blessing that there will not be room enough to receive it'" (Mal. 3:10).

In the context, the people had turned away from their responsibility to give tithes and offerings to God, and were instead keeping them for themselves. Maybe it was for, in our words, good reasons: family expenses, saving for retirement, vacation, Christmas is coming, etc. We don't know. God gives them a challenge, however, to stop concerning themselves so much with the temporal, material things of life, to give those offerings to Him, and be willing to let Him be in control. "Bring all the tithes into the storehouse, that My house may be full, and try Me now in this..." (Mal. 3:10). "Trust Me! I dare you! And see if I don't take care of all those worries of yours with blessings beyond belief!" What a dare! That's God's challenge for us today. Be willing to not worry about the material things, and trust Him. Let Him take care of that stuff!

Was that not the message of Jesus? "Therefore do not worry, saying 'What shall we eat?' or, 'What shall we drink?' or, 'What shall we wear?' But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you" (Matthew 6:31,33). Try Him! I dare you!

## "Memories are made of things like this!"

Some of us are old enough to remember the popular song by this title. Isn't it wonderful that God has created us in such a way as to be able to remember. No wonder the psalmist could say, "we are fearfully and wonderfully made" (Psa. 139:14). The history of God's people in both the Old and New Testaments shows that God wants us to remember. The Passover was to be a reminder of the night in Egypt when God's people strictly obeyed the message of salvation. Remember, "the death angel" came to bring death to the first born both of man and beast. In the New Testament the early Christians partook of the Lord's Supper (communion - 1st Cor. 10:16) each first day of every week as a reminder of the horrible death of Jesus. (Acts 20:7). Peter, in his second epistle, wrote several times about the importance of remembering. Yes, memories have a purpose. I believe that God today wants us to be drawn closer to each other from memories which might have happened years before. The Apostle Paul commands us "..rejoice with them that rejoice, and weep with them that weep" (Rom. 12:15). How can we unless we remember? Agreed, some of our memories are sad and some are happy! Even so, God has a way of "turning our mourning into joy" (Jer. 31:13). Let us then trust in the promises of God and allow our memories to bring us closer and closer to each other which in the process brings us closer to the Lord. (Amen?)
