

THE FREE MORAL ASPECTS OF MANKIND

No doubt you have heard the expression "man is a free moral agent." Of course, this is often used in reference to one's own preference, especially when it comes to his acceptance or rejection of the spiritual calling of our Lord (2nd Thess. 2:14). There is much to be said in this regard. First, God has given us his word (2nd Tim. 3:16-17) and the instructions of this Holy Book act as a divine invitation from our Lord. However, there is also another way of looking at this thought. While God is not willing that any should perish (2nd Pet. 3:9) and because he loved us "while we are yet sinners" (Rom 5:8), he extends his free invitation to all. Here it is: "Come unto me, all ye that labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me: for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light" (Matt.11:28-30). You see, God has so made us that he does give us a choice of how we are to live. The sad part of this thought is this: How much better off we would be by accepting him at his word instead of trying to futilely direct our own steps in life (Jer. 10:23). History has shown that some want to force their doctrine on others but our Lord says, "...and whosoever will, let him take the water of life freely" (Rev. 22:17). No man must try to force his convictions on anyone but out of our love for humanity, we must invite all to "taste and see that the Lord is good" (Psa. 34:8).
