TWO GREAT QUESTIONS

About a year ago, one of our *Know Your Bible* students e-mailed us what he described as "a few questions that I'm struggling with." His note said that he was hoping we would be able to offer some answers. On his list was this line: "Must I be baptized in water in order to be saved? ... And then what does 'saved' mean?"

These are two questions which have such significant implications that they deserve to be thought through by all of us. I offered our friend the following brief responses in the hope that they would assist him in his Bible studies. It may be that these summaries will be of benefit to the rest of us, too.

The last question first: what "saved" means. In the scriptures to be "saved" means to be "rescued" or "delivered" from slavery to the practice of sin and from the condemnation of sin and death. It means being a beneficiary of what Jesus, by the grace of God, has done for us (Heb. 2:9; 5:9). Being saved, being ransomed or redeemed, having one's soul purified, and being born again are parallel phrases (1 Pet. 1:9, 18, 22, 23). It means that a person who was spiritually dead in trespasses and sins is made alive together with Christ and is waiting for the kindness God still intends to show us (Eph. 2:1-7). It means that one has been delivered from the domain of darkness by forgiveness and transferred into the kingdom of Christ (Col. 2:13, 14).

Now to the other question: whether baptism has any place in this process. The baptism of persons who are repenting toward God and turning in faith toward Christ in order to be saved is taught in the New Testament in the following ways:

a) in the commission with which the Lord sent the apostles out in the first place (Matt. 28:19-20; Mk. 16:15-16); b) in the cases we have where penitent and believing people were told what the Lord wanted them to do (Acts 2:38; 10:48; 22:16); c) in the situations where we have descriptions of what believing people did in their response to the gospel (Acts 8:12, 36-39; 9:18; 16:30-34; 18:8; 19:5; and note the wide-ranging settings involving people from both Jewish and Gentile backgrounds); d) the various passages in which baptism is assumed as the basis for the reasoning (possible examples are Rom. 6:3-4; 1 Cor. 6:11; Col. 2:12); and e) the passages which state that, in some sense, baptism saves (one example is 1 Pet. 3:21).

One thing we might all learn from our friend who raised these important questions is that he did not use the "will I be lost if I don't" approach. He realized, as all of us surely must, that the gospel comes to a humanity already lost and calls us to hope based on the work of Christ. The question is whether we can believe the offer and whether we are willing to accept it.



I believe that all scripture, from the beginning of the book of Genesis through Revelation, focuses on Jesus Christ, His Gospel and His Church and even beyond, meaning the destination of the souls of men and women.
