Mighty Men And Strong Support

I've been reading about the mighty men who helped David be established as king over all Israel, as they are said to have done in chapters 11 and 12 of 1 Chronicles. The kingdom had just experienced the tragic decline of Saul when David was more like a fugitive than a king, in danger both from Saul and from enemies like the Philistines. God had still been with him, and David had become greater and greater (11:9).

But God gave his help through helpers-mighty men (12:18). We are told that "from day to day men came to David to help him, until there was a great army, like an army of God" (12:22). It was David's mighty men "who gave him strong support in his kingdom" so that he was made king according to the Lord's word (11:10).

And why was their support so meaningful? Because they were mighty men – men who had earned respect. The things we are told about some of them are revealing. These were the kind of men who had "won a name" (11:24). If one was a "leader over" others, it was because he had been "a mighty man among" them (12:4). These were capable individuals who had proven that they could help (12:1, 2). They were all men who had taken their stand, wielded their strength, risked their lives, helped - men of valor.

The manner in which the support of David's mighty men is said to have been exercised is also quite instructive. Apparently, simply being mighty isn't enough. These were "men who had understanding of the times" and who could, therefore, see what ought to be done (12:32). They were equipped to help "with singleness of purpose" (12:33). They were not only "seasoned" but also "ready" (12:36). These were men who came to David "with full intent" and "of a single mind" to make him king in obedience to God (12:38). No wonder their presence meant "joy in Israel" (12:40)!

The strong support of mighty men. I wonder if their has ever been a time when the cause of the Lord didn't need that more than just about anything else.

Rise up, O men of God! Have done with lesser things; Give heart and mind and soul and strength To serve the King of kings.

IS SILENCE REALLY GOLDEN (as in Golden Agers?)

Before I answer this question, may I share with you the definitions of the word "Golden?" It means, "made of, or containing, or pertaining to gold; having the color of gold; precious; favorable." You can see that there are many avenues of thought wrapped up in these definitions. Now, you have probably heard the old saying, "Silence is Golden." In most cases this is true. In the epistle of James he wrote, "slow to speak" but he also said in the same passage be "swift to hear" (James 1:19). Naturally, these are not contradictions but that there are occasions in which both should be applied. Let's now consider these thoughts to our work here at Water Mill's Golden Age endeavors: No, they are not made of gold! Even though all our printed materials have the color of gold, it is still not gold. However, if you were to talk with many shut-ins that the Golden Agers visit, have prayer with and often give little gifts, those dear ones might say "they are precious - they are favorable - and surely they have the right name - - GOLDEN AGERS." I think I can safely say and equally identify those working in this capacity that as they bring a little joy and peace of mind to the recipients of their labors, they also lay up for themselves treasures in heaven where the Apostle John writes that the "city and the street" is of PURE GOLD (Rev. 21:18; 21). That's been our goal and challenge from the beginning. May silence now give way to action. Let this be your challenge also.
