Where has the Time Gone?

"What is your life? It is even a vapor that appears for a little time and then vanishes away" (James 4:14).

An old WV friend of mine used to joke often, "Time waits for no man and very few women." He's right, isn't he? (about the time not waiting part. If you ever find those women, I want to meet them:) Life seems to speed up with every passing day. It seems like yesterday we were looking forward to the changing beauty of the leaves, and the cooler weather that came with them. Now we are itching for warm soil so we could till up the ground for the garden – unbelievable that spring is just around the corner. "Time flies!" we say, heads shaking. Really, though, it isn't a bad thing that time does seem to fly. What makes it bad is when it flies by wasted, unused and unfulfilling and unproductive.

Paul told the Ephesians, "Be very careful, then, how you live—not as unwise but as wise, making the most of every opportunity" (Ephesians. 5:15, 16). Many versions translate that last phrase, "redeeming the time." We would say, "Don't let time slip away from you." Take advantage of every minute of life. Don't allow the days, weeks, months, or years to pass by unknowingly.

What are you doing with your time to "make the most of every opportunity"? Is there a loved one who is starving for your attention? Redeem that time. Is there an old friendship strained or lost because of past faults? Redeem that time. Is there a grocery cashier who needs your smile today? Redeem that time. Is there a lonely neighbor who just needs someone to love them? Redeem that time. Is the church in need of your talents? Redeem that time. We all know that the list could go on. Where is your time needed? Make the most of opportunities presented. Redeem that time!

David said once, "But truly, as the Lord lives and as your soul lives, there is but a step between me and death" (1 Samuel 20:3). Time is fleeting, as James reminded us. We don't know if we have tomorrow. We don't know when we will be called to leave our bodies for eternity, for life truly is, "here for a little time and then vanishes away." Thus, the most important question is asked: "Is there a Savior waiting for your love, obedience and commitment?" Be assured that He is... Redeem that time.





A BYWORD AMONG THE HEATHEN

In Psalm 44:14 one of the concerns of the Psalmist was that God's people might become a "byword" among the non-believers. One of the truths connected with the Bible is that people do not change just because a new year, decade or century has passed. They change because they want to change! But holding this thought close to the mind, there is a fact that can rise among even God's people today. Jesus knew this and thus issued forth the following admonition to those of his day. "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven" (Matt. 5:16). Another realistic truth is that Satan will use every conceivable avenue to push out publicly the slightest bit of bad news which reflects on God's people. Knowing this is true, those of us who proudly wear the name of Christian must constantly be on guard to "keep that which has been committed unto us against that day" (2nd Tim. 1:12). I have observed for many years how that the entertainment world (Movies, TV and the Media) has used some seemingly religious figure as part of their script, but before the program was over they projected him as being corrupt in so many ways. Don't ever think that there are not eyes watching us today to find some reason for making us a "byword" whereby they can criticize those who are following Jesus Christ, the Son of God. While we cannot be responsible for the actions of others, we can with God's help be in control of self.
