Our Common Life

This title is a way of understanding what occurs in congregational life: we have fellowship. As children in the family of God, our lives touch and we care about each other. As members of the body of Christ, we have a work together in his service. As citizens of his kingdom, we are subjects of the same ruler and sharers in the same way of life. As priests in a spiritual house, we meet together and we offer spiritual sacrifices. The practice of a common life by such means as these is a necessary and wonderful characteristic of the New Testament church, and it always has been (cf. Acts 2:42).

We're using Acts right now as the guide and source for our messages each Lord's day. One study will be on a character (or characters) in the chapter before us, and the other will deal with a biblical doctrine at play in the passage. We think this will be a good way to remind ourselves what the Way means in our lives. This week our doctrine will be the nature of the gospel (what sets it apart from the religions of man) and our characters will be members of the early church. There are matters to consider in this chapter that will have to be in the background of everything else we read in Acts.

The class series on "The Pilgrim Church" began last Sunday morning. It is both relevant and necessary to do some thinking on how the Lord's people are to conduct themselves in the midst of a culture which does not share their values. I thought our "Peak of the Week" class got off to a good start Wednesday evening. Dennis will be beginning a new series in his Sunday class on "Our Favorite Psalms." Adam's new Wednesday evening series got delayed (he had a very valid excuse!) But it will get started this week. Spring is a great time to get more involved in a class—or to invite a friend or a family member to one!

We have had many things and many loved ones to pray over in recent days. That has made us more aware of—and thankful for—those who practice kindness in word and deed. How grateful we are for simple, thoughtful, caring service by individuals who saw an opportunity to do good.



JOSIAH SET A GOOD RECORD FOR ALL

In Romans 15:4 the Apostle Paul wrote, "For whatsoever things were written afore time were written for our learning, that we through patience and comfort of the scriptures might have hope." For this cause we would all do well to spend more time in the Old Testament than possibly we do. Each event as well as each individual offers us lessons that could improve our spiritual lives today as well as make life here on earth more pleasant. Take for example the life of Josiah who came to the throne at the age of 8 years "and he reigned in Jerusalem for 31 years" (2nd Chron. 34:1). In the next verse we find that "he did that which was right in the sight of the Lord, and walked in the ways of David his father, and declined neither to the right hand, nor the left." In other words, he was not influenced by the pressures of life from outside sources whenever and wherever they came. Another Old Testament passage put it this way: "Thou shall not follow a multitude to do evil" (Exod. 23:2). The pressures of life often come to the faithful Christian from both sides of the spectrum. Today this holds true whether we are talking about political parties or simply things identified with liberal or conservative issues. Some of these terms, unfortunately, have had their "influences" on many in the church. We would still do well to follow the old slogan to "speak where the Bible speaks and remain silent where the Bible is silent." If it ever worked well, it still will!
