Spirituality in the Church

WATER MILL CHURCH OF CHR

The twelfth chapter of 1 Corinthians is evidence that spiritual gifts were never a guarantee of spirituality in people. Human beings too easily mistook the experience for the responsibility and began to measure all things by the attention and fulfillment it brought them personally. That tendency is still with us, and a scriptural and healthy grasp of what spirituality in the church means is perhaps the only antidote.

Spirituality in the church springs from the realization that all of us draw our life and vitality from the same source. If we are alive in Christ, it is because we have in one Spirit all been baptized into one body and because we have all been made to drink of one Spirit (v. 13). Each of us owes everything to the same Spirit, the same Lord, the same God (v. 4-6).

Spirituality in the church develops as we turn our attention toward acting in the common good (v. 7). This is otherwise known as loving, and it is the intentional behavior which gives many to any ability or function in the body.

Spirituality increases in the church as we begin to realize that, even though we may be different from others and not able to do the same things others may do, we still belong (v. 14). After all, a body functions by having members that serve different purposes (v. 17). Besides, God put them there himself (v. 18)!

Spirituality in the church deepens through respect of the fact that we need each other so badly (v. 21). In fact, it is not the outstanding and impressive parts that enable the body to flourish, but the ones who operate without much notice at all–and this also is the design of God (v. 24). Appreciation of behind the scenes service is such a mark of spirituality!

Spirituality in the church brings us to a unity (v. 25). When we are thriving spiritually, we have the same care for one another. When one member suffers, all suffer together; when one is honored, all rejoice together (v. 26). That is what a healthy body does.

"Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it" (1 Cor. 12:27).

THEY WERE CALLED TEMPLE SERVANTS **By Dennis R. Smith**

In reading from the Old Testament we perhaps remember the great heroes such as Moses, Joshua, David, and Daniel while overlooking a small group of servants called Nethinims (NEHTH - uh - neams). Also, if following the newer translations, often the name of this group is not given and in place thereof they are called "temple servants." Their history dates back to Joshua 9:23-27 when there were Gibeonites who deceived Joshua. Because of their pretentiousness they were taken in as slaves and made to be hewers and carriers of wood and water and scrubbers of temple utensils. As time went on they were included with others from the Israelites who were taken captive into Babylon and even some returned to Jerusalem along with those mentioned in the books of Ezra and Nehemiah. (See Ezra 2:58; Nehemiah 10:28). It would seem that they were a group with a non-Jewish background but who were content with just being slaves or servants in the house of God. While many things changed with the worship of God, as is authorized by the New Testament, yet we surely can receive a great lesson from this group of temple servants. The Apostle Paul wrote "But God be thanked, that ye were the servants of sin, but ye have obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine which was delivered you. Being then made free from sin, ye became the servants of righteousness" (Rom. 6:17-18). Shouldn't we then be content as were the Nethinims when we are faced with menial opportunities which have little prestige but are necessary to the work of the Lord in his church? Amen?
