CALL HER BLESSED

BEING "FRAMED" BY OUR LORD

What a terrible statement for one to make about Jesus who died on the cross of Calvary for the sins of the world. However, this description is used by the Apostle Paul in Ephesians 2:19-22: "Now therefore ye are no more strangers and foreigners, but fellow citizens with the saints, and of the household of God; And are built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ himself being the chief corner stone: In whom all the building <u>fitly framed together</u> groweth unto an holy temple in the Lord: In whom ye also are builded together for an habitation of God through the Spirit" (KJV). When you look at the word "framed" in this light it becomes quite a compliment to the individual Christian as well as the whole body and brotherhood of the church. It is obvious that the Apostle is using the framework of a building to give a beautiful analogy of what should exist among those who have been washed in the blood of God's dear Son. The main thought here is that this kind of unity must exist among brethren in order to determine whether they are qualified to be called "the holy temple in the Lord" (Eph. 2:21). This same thought is carried over into chapter four where Paul uses the words "fitly joined together" to illustrate how the work of the Lord can be successful. Only can this be when we have accepted the charge to become the <u>framework</u> of the church and loving each other as God commands (John 13:34).
