GREAT CATCH!

If you've seen any news in the last few days you've surely heard about this. Christina Torre, a teacher in New York, is walking to work one morning when she notices a frightening scene. A toddler (who turns out to be sixteen months old) is in a precarious place up on the fire escape landing between the second and third floors of an apartment building. Dialing 911 and keeping her eye on the child, she hurries over to the spot. While she is still speaking to the emergency dispatcher, the little one falls from the railing high above–and she catches him in her arms!

Though such a rescue of a young life is amazing enough in and of itself, Christina Torre's great catch is even more so because of who she is. Her father is Joe Torre, the highly respected former baseball player and manager who is now Vicepresident for Baseball Operations for Major League Baseball. No doubt he made some outstanding catches during his career, but none that have a meaning anywhere close to the one his daughter made!

The thought of a child being saved because someone's arms are beneath has a meaning still more precious to us. We remember that as Moses came to the end of his journey, he blessed the people saved by the LORD with this blessing: "The eternal God is your dwelling place, and underneath are the everlasting arms" (Deut. 33:27, 29).

The everlasting arms, however, are not at work only in cases of emergency. They are images of God's care and keeping of his people at all times and through all things. He tends his flock like a shepherd, gathers the lambs in his arms, and carries them in his bosom (Isa. 40:11). He bends down to feed his children, takes them up by their arms as one who heals their hurts and eases their burdens, and leads them with ties of kindness and love (Hos. 11:3-4). No one can snatch them from his hand (John 10:28). What a wonderful way to understand our assurance in the Lord!

But there is something else here as well. What of our arms on behalf of people around us? We who know of the everlasting arms have something to offer those around us–something they'll find nowhere else. Everyone needs life that is not in free -fall! And beyond that, as brothers and sisters in the Lord, our arms are a much needed blessing when engaged in mutual burden-bearing. Who knows what kind of catch we might make?

We extend our sympathy to Gene Lund and his family in the loss of his uncle who passed away last week. He was 100 years old.


Welcome Mary Head, Kenna Taylor's mother, has

WISE IN OUR OWN CONCEITS

There are a lot of old sayings that are worth their weight in gold. Have you ever heard "I've outsmarted myself?" Then there's another one similar to it which says "I got caught in my own trap." There is even another, "Give a man enough rope and he will hang himself." I don't know how these things get started, but it just might be they have come from the Old King James Version of the Bible. Several times in the Bible the expression "Be not wise in your own conceits" comes up (See Prov. 26:5,12; Rom. 11:25:12:16). Some of the newer translations might cut it somewhat shorter and simply say "do not be conceited." It seems to me that the word "wise" adds a dimension that may not be there in some cases. Could it be that sometimes we may be guilty of thinking we are smarter than we are. Check out some more passages on this thought. In Romans 12:3, the Apostle Paul commanded to "not think more highly of self than we ought to think." Then another verse states "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, And lean not on your own understanding" (Prov. 3:5). Two other places in the Proverbs say the same thing in a little different way: "All the ways of a man are pure in his own eves" and "There is a way that seems right to a man, But its end is the way of death" (Prov. 14:12, 16:2, 25). To sum it all up, think on this: "It is not in man that walketh to direct his own steps" (Jer. 10:23). Wouldn't it be best then to "Mind not high things...and be not wise in your own conceits" (Rom. 12:16)?
