"Whatever You Do"

The New Testament lays down great principles to guide us even in circumstances it does not specifically address. It expects those who have been raised with Christ to so learn Christ that they can use these principles to distinguish good from evil in any situation. Consider, for example, these three guidelines for whatever we do:

1. <u>Do it FOR the glory of God</u>. "So, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God" (I Cor. 10:31). Do what will leave a shining impression of your Father's love and holiness. The context indicates that the application of this principle involves the willingness to give up personal interests for the good of others. What cannot be done to strengthen, bless and encourage the kingdom of God should not be done.

2. <u>Do it BY the authority of Christ</u>. "And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him" (Col. 3:17). Act as one for whom Jesus is Lord. Respect his authority in all matters. A grateful child of God is not meant to live with a "the Lord didn't say not to" mindset. Rather, God's chosen ones think, "what does the Lord want? What has he said?" To them, "Christ is all, and in all" (Col. 3:11).

3. <u>Do it FROM the heart.</u> "Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men" (Col. 3:23). Face the responsibilities of everyday life with reverence for the Lord, realizing that you are in his presence at all times. Be sincere and faithful, desiring the Lord's approval and expecting his reward. Demonstrate that "you are serving the Lord Christ" (Col. 3:24).

These principles are big enough to call forth the most noble conduct in any circumstance. They are broad enough to make us accountable in every situation. One who lives by them will take to heart all that Scripture says, but he will have standards which run deeper than rules.

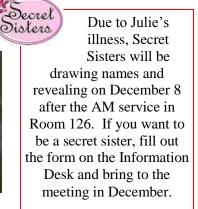

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Jesus teaches us a Lesson on Memory Work

Sometimes I get the feeling that when preachers quote a scripture to make a point that it is considered "old fashioned" and that they are only bragging about their knowledge of the Bible. If that should be the case, let us remember that the New Testament writers quoted scripture many times. For that matter, Jesus would have won the prize in that contest. I have before me even now a chart showing that Jesus quoted the Old Testament some 45 times in his ministry for different occasions. Using the words of Peter, "...because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that we should follow his steps" (1st Pet. 2:21), those of us should count it an honor to know enough about the Bible to be able to quote from it. In retrospect, I can remember when most preachers would be criticized if they didn't have an arsenal of scriptures to defend their point. However, this is still not the purpose of this article. In our world today we are bombarded on every angle with temptations, temptations and more temptations! Using the example of Christ again, we would do well to ward off every temptation by quoting in our mind and heart what God has revealed to us that is right or wrong. (See the temptations of Christ from Matthew 4 and Luke 4). Christians need everything they can get hold of today to stay faithful to him that loved us. What better weapon do we have in that regard than an abundance of memory verses implanted deeply in our heart and mind?
