You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. (Matt. 5:14)

<u>The Problem of Sin</u>

While reading the beginning of First John, I've been realizing again that the faith of Christ is our only means of recognizing the absolute tragedy of sin in our lives without at the same time regarding ourselves completely ruined, worthless and alone. Perhaps no other kind of balance is as crucial to life and well-being as this.

John speaks to both edges of the problem. If, on the one hand, any of us are inclined to claim that we have no sin, or that, if we do, it is not so bad that it impacts our standing with God, he says that we are deceiving ourselves, that the truth is not in us, and that we are making the Lord a liar (1:6, 8, 10). If, on the other hand, despite our intention not to make sin our way of life, we still do sin, and are inclined to consider it the failed end of our story, John says that we have an advocate who has made a settlement for sin (2:1, 2).

It's when we are in touch with both these poles of the axis of truth that we are prepared to function healthily in relation to the Lord, other people, and ourselves. Yes, sin is a disaster which always, in some manner, makes us like lonely and condemned slaves. But yes, someone has valued us enough to ransom us, clean us up, and give us access. Nothing but the faith of Christ can realistically allow these two themes to coexist in the same life.

Let's face it: sin is a sad and ruinous fact in the personal experience of each one of us. Wherever our nature is not like the Lord's is, or wherever we don't believe what he says or do as he wills, or wherever we don't love people as he does, we sin (1:6; 2:4, 9). Our lives begin to miss the mark. Condemnation begins to dog us.

But let's rejoice: Christ is the sufficient resolution of the problem of sin. During his earthly ministry, he bore the judgment of our sins in his own body on the tree (2:2). In his heavenly ministry, he serves as our righteous advocate with the Father (2:1). When we called on his name in obedience to the gospel, he washed away our sins (Acts 22:16). As we walk with him in the light, intending to maintain fellowship with him, he goes on cleansing us of all sin (1:7). Even when sin does intrude, if we confess it, he can be depended upon to forgive (1:9).

Never make light of the reality of sin. Never sin on purpose. Never allow sin once done to dominate your life. That is the balance the faith of Christ makes possible.

GOD'S AWARENESS IN SCRIPTURE AND SONG

In using the word "awareness" let us understand its meaning which simply is being "aware or attentive to a need." May I suggest that the God of Heaven is fully aware of everyone and everything. Especially is this so as he looks down on those who have been responsive to the Gospel of His Son and continue in faithful service to him. Let me also share with you some words from Psalm 115:12: "*The Lord hath been mindful of us; he will bless the house of Israel.*" While this promise was made in the Old Testament concerning God's People, the same continues in the New. "*Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights, with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning" (James 1:17).* Brother L. O. Sanderson, who was the dean of songwriters among Churches of Christ, no doubt was aware of Psalm 115:12 when he wrote the beautiful song, "*The Lord Has Been Mindful of Me.*" Look at the power and promises in his song: "*Though I, through the valley of shadow, O'er mountain or troubled sea, And oft in the darkness, have traveled, The Lord has been mindful of me. The Lord has been mindful of me! He blesses again! My God is the God of the living! How excellent is His name!" Both in Scripture and Song we can see God's awareness. As a closure - think on this - "For the eyes of the Lord are over the righteous, and his ears are open unto their prayers" (1st Peter 3:12).*
