You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. (Matt. 5:14)

Observations

Once in a science class during my school days we were required to keep a journal, filling it with observations regarding the trees, plants, soils, birds and animals we encountered in our part of the natural world. It was, and is, a good life exercise to try, and it has seemed especially appropriate recently. Circumstances have included odd weather, an unusual time of the year, and kind of a different place in my life. Here are some of the things I've been noticing.

1. It's probably good for us to be reminded once in a while that there are some things over which we do not have control. A simple weather event involving a little well-timed snow and ice can do that quite effectively! We can plan activities and schedule events and have our intentions, but we're not in charge of the world, and there are still a lot of things we can't do a thing about. A little reminder doesn't hurt.

2. Related, but on a bit more of a spiritual level: apart from the Lord, we can do nothing! That's what he himself said to his disciples in John 15:5. His servants are related to him like branches are to the vine. The life and the production derive from him; their great task is to abide in him. That's easy to forget. We get to wanting to "help him out." It would be better to be sure we are abiding in him, gaining our identity and our purpose from who he is.

3. It surely is good to be able to look forward to being with others who have that aim. A few days of limited ability to be out and about as much as normal makes us even more glad for the privilege of meeting with those who share our faith. There is something about the assembly with our family in the Lord which assures us that things are OK and which anticipates the fulfillment of our common hope.

4. The darker and colder a night is, the brighter and more impressive the light seems. Maybe you've also notice this with the moon and stars during these winter nights, or even with some of the colorful holiday lights in your neighborhood. I wonder if there isn't a life-lesson in this as well.

5. I'm glad there are times of the year that allow for breaks in routines, a little excitement, some family traditions, any grateful thinking that contributes to peace and joy, and a bit of renewal in our lives. It would be great if we could avoid getting so stressed trying to pull off the perfect holiday production that we miss all of that. I hope you and yours have a good one!

BIBLE QUESTIONS WHICH MUST BE CONSIDERED TODAY

- (g) "Will You Also Go Away?" was asked by Jesus to some of his disciples (John 6:67).
- (h) "What is Your Life?" the question of the ages asked in the book of James (4:14).

Of course there are many others but surely these should help us examine our own lives to see how we stand with our Creator. As we are nearing the close of this old year, maybe these questions need to be answered by us all. Remember this - whatever the question, God has the answer!
